The struggle continues, and God is present within all of it. There is hope. There is Light. Praying Love leads us - always.

Together with you in this journey, Pastor Santina by Mary Oliver It doesn't have to be the blue iris, it could be weeds in a vacant lot, or a few small stones; just pay attention, then patch a few words together and don't try to make them elaborate, this isn't a contest but the doorway into thanks, and a silence in which another voice may speak.



New Worship Series May through Pentecost: Resurrection Revelation

Throughout the month of May we will explore readings from the Book of Revelation, which contains some of the most cryptic language and most fanciful imagery in the entire Bible. Texts from this book have been used for many purposes throughout its history from offering hope to early Christians and inspiring faithful strength and endurance during their persecution to trying to forecast the events of the 'end times.' We will take a different approach at Hope UCC. For us today, exploring it together during the season of Easter draws us to another contemporary application of this book: reading it as a guide to experiencing the resurrected life and focusing on some of the core characteristics that define who we are called to be as Resurrection People. How can our lives reflect the good news of this ongoing new life? John's vision as told through Revelation allows us to see the world, the church, and the Christian life in the way God envisions it: not for how it is, but for how it can be. And each week, through the power of the One who makes all things new, we are called to make those possibilities a resurrection reality. We hope to see you in church for this new worship series as we study this interesting book of scripture together.



Tuesday Night Bible Study in May: Revelation for Everyone

If you are like your pastor, you have avoided the Book of Revelation unless it was required for a seminary class. That is all about to change! Let's get together and explore it – bravely asking questions without any judgement. How else will we learn more about this interesting part of our Bible? Please join us for our new Tuesday evening Bible study where we will explore the Book of Revelation.

One of the reasons I have avoided Revelation is because of the way it has been interpreted as foretelling doom and all the talk about rapture and end times. However, we will discover it is much more complex than this and offers much inspiration through its symbolic language and imagery. There is a good reason it has captured the imaginations of both religious and secular communities and is referenced not only in religious studies but also in popular culture in art, film, and literature.

Our study will be based mainly on the work of New Testament scholar, theologian, and Anglican Bishop N.T. Wright. I hope it will open up this fascinating book of our Bible for all us to new understandings and strengthening our faith and spiritual journeys.

We will meet Tuesdays: May 6, 13, 20, 27 and June 3 from 6:30-8:00 P.M. Please let Pastor Santina or the church office know if you have any questions or that you will attend some or all of the sessions so that we have enough materials.

PRAY TOGETHER

1. Prayer Partners Ministry

Volunteers covenant to engage in daily prayer for those on our prayer list. Prayer Partners will meet on the 4th Sunday of the month following worship (Zoom available) to pray together and update our prayer list. Begins in November.

2. Prayer Shawl Ministry

Volunteers crochet, knit, sew, or quilt prayer shawls or lap blankets to be given to our homebound or ill members and friends. This group meets once a month (or more often if you'd like) to in order to create together (although this is not required). Shawls and lap blankets can be made at home too and brought to Hope UCC.

3. Sanctuary Decoration/Visual Arts Ministry

Volunteers help set the sanctuary and church building for special seasons/occasions such as Advent, Lent, Pentecost, and various worship series. This may include setting the poinsettias and Easter lilies in addition to other decorating and brainstorming activities throughout the year. If you enjoy creative collaboration, please join us here. You will be called on at different times throughout the year.

4. Communion Preparation

Volunteers prepare the monthly communion service by purchasing and cutting gluten free bread and filling the communion cups with juice as well as the larger loaf the pastor uses in the liturgy. Volunteers also keep note of the inventory of all Communion elements. All expenses are reimbursed through the Worship and Music Budget. These volunteers also set up the Chancel area with the Communion Table for Communion Sundays.

5. Sunday Volunteer
