

In the Midst of the Rubble

“And they said unto me, The remnant that are left of the captivity there in the province are in great affliction and reproach: the wall of Jerusalem also is broken down, and the gates thereof are burned with fire” (Nehemiah 1:3).

Today's direction all started with a prayer (see below). I feel strongly I am to post this in place of what I had planned. You can identify with this passage and in some ways it resembles your life.

These broken areas are the very areas where God wants to do something today. Some of you feel like a city that has been invaded. Your walls have been broken down. You feel exiled and are living among the ruins of your life. In the midst of the rubble, He is there.

Many disappointments have left you feeling crushed under the weight of them. The sting of betrayal has left it's impression on your heart. You feel vulnerable, exposed and ransacked by the enemy. In the midst of the rubble, He is there.

The Lord says, “Don't fret over the broken places in your life or the deep hurts within your heart. Nothing is impossible with Him.” You will rise from the rubble because He is with you.

It is the Lord your God who is rebuilding those broken areas of your life. He wants to restore things, remove things that have hindered you and rebuild you into His image. He sees what is in your heart. He knows your thoughts.

He wants you to come to Him. He wants your raw honesty concerning where you are. As you come to Him in your brokenness, He will rebuild those areas and restore you.

He will fix the things that were once broken within you. He will repair, patch and replace. He is calling to you to cry out to HIM for help and HIS answer will bring rebuilding.
