With a collection of approximately 75,000 books, movies, magazines, audiobooks, music CDs and video games and free, convenient access to the collections in the other 41 libraries in the OWWL Library System, there is truly something for everyone.

Not able to come to the library but need something to read or listen to? Check out the Libby app for access to thousands of free downloadable ebooks, audiobooks and magazines that you can borrow with your OWWL library card - and you can apply for a card online at owl.org under the "Help" tab. And Newark Public Library cardholders have access to additional digital content, including TV and movies, through hoopladigital.com or the hoopla app.

Check out the library's website and calendar of events at newarklibrary.org to see the extensive menu of programs, classes and events for people of all ages. You can sign up for any event right there on the online calendar of events and receive a convenient email or text reminder as the event approaches. And you should friend us on Facebook and follow us on Instagram to keep up with everything that's going on at the library.

Families can come and explore the Children's Room, with a play room, games & activities and a Wii gaming system or Nintendo Switches kids can use while there.

If you need to use a computer or print something out, the library has 5 desktop computers available for use with a library card or a guest pass, and laptops and tablets you can borrow to use in the library. Printing is available for \$0.25 for black and white and \$0.50 for color.

Need something faxed or scanned to email? Scanning to email or a flash/thumb drive is free and faxing is just \$1, regardless of the number of pages. The library also has staff who are notaries - call the library to check availability.

If you're looking for a meeting space, the Newark Public Library is the place to go. With free meeting rooms holding anywhere from 6 people to 50 and online reservations through the "Reserve a Room" button on the library's website, it couldn't be any more convenient to use the library's facilities for your next personal or professional meeting.

The library receives the *Finger Lakes Time* and the *Democrat & Chronicle* daily, so if newspaper subscriptions have become too expensive and you've canceled yours, just come to the library to read the paper and catch up on the latest news.

We have a free jigsaw puzzle exchange year-round and always have a puzzle out in the library that you can drop in and work on. And while you're visiting, you can tour the wonderful Hoffman Clock Museum, which is housed in the library and open during regular library hours.
