Your Calling - Part 1 By Vern Deadmond

I want to ask you a question, do you know what God has called you to do in this life? Be honest with your answer, because most Christians really don't know what God has called them to do. I remember when I was young, when I heard any message about being called, in my imagination I thought the speaker was talking about being a pastor. I was like, no way, not me, not in this lifetime. And as the years went by, some speakers would clarify that everyone is called, but not necessarily to full time ministry in the five-fold (pastor, teacher, evangelist, prophet, or apostle), and I was to discover what my calling was. Well, it took me a long time to discover what the one single, common calling is for every born-again Christian. The moment we receive Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, everyone is called to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. In *Matthew 28:18-20*, Jesus was speaking to His eleven remaining disciples and said, "All authority has been given to like in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptising them in the name of the Pather and of the San and of the Kely Spirit, teaching them to abserve all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the and of the age," (NKJV) Take note here, Jesus told his disciples to go make more disciples, He didn't say go save everyone you can, making converts so we can populate Heaven when they die.

When we receive Jesus into our hearts, we are expected to become a disciple of Jesus. Pastors, teachers, evangelists, prophets, and apostles were called to be disciples before they were called into ministry. We are called to be disciples first, and then we can go make other disciples. The original disciples of Jesus spent over three years with Him before Jesus released them to go make more disciples. If you are not a disciple, then how are you going to disciple someone else? This is why the original twelve disciples spent three years with Jesus, they were going to Bible school.

Before you go any further in reading, I ask you not just to read what I have to say, but open your heart, think about what I have written, and give it consideration in your life. Don't just read this and go on to the next thing you do. My prayer for you is that God, by the Holy Spirit, will speak to your heart and fan the flame inside of you and you will have a greater desire for the things of God, in Jesus' name - Amen.

I was raised in church, born-again and filled with the baptism of the Holy Spirit at a young age, but it wasn't until I was in my early 50's that I heard an emphasis placed on discipleship. I realized I had been living my own life waiting for the return of Jesus, and not living for Jesus. I went to church all those years, hearing the importance of taking the gospel to the world so the world will be saved. I agree completely that souls need to be saved, but it is not to stop there. Once we believe and receive Jesus, we are called to be one of His disciples. When I set my heart to be a disciple of Jesus, I discovered what eternal life is. I learned my concept of eternal life was lacking full revelation, as is with most Christians today they do not have a proper understanding of **John 3:16**, where Jesus says, "For God so loved the world, that the gave His only begotian San, that whose ever believes in Him should not partial, but have every every fille."

One of the first, great revelations I received from the Word of God as a disciple was that eternal life is knowing God the Father and His Son, Jesus Christ. (John 17:3) We can have eternal life here at this moment in our life, we do not have to die to have eternal life. Let me say, it is a terrible waste to not enjoy the eternal life God has given each one of us NOW. He paid a tremendous price for it, and, "We are not to ignore or neglect this so great a salvation." (Hebrews 2:3)

So many of the churches today emphasis converting the sinner leaving out discipleship. There is scriptural context that converts need to be made disciples in the **Book of Acts**. One particular instance is when Barnabas was sent to Antioch (a city in present day Turkey) by the church in Jerusalem, because there were a great number of people who turned and believed the Lord, they were converted. After he arrived, he encouraged the converts to continue with the Lord, and there were many more that were added to the Kingdom of Heaven. Let's pick up in **Acts 11:25**, "**Then Barnabas departed for Tarsus to seek Paul. And when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch."** We see Barnabas and Paul spent a year discipling the believers and they were called Christians. So, is it reasonable to say if you are going to take Christ's name, you should set your heart to be a disciple?

Webster's 1828 Dictionary defines disciple as a learner; a scholar; one who receives or professes to receive instruction from another. A follower; an adherent to the doctrines of Jesus. Hence the constant attendants of Christ were called His disciples; and hence all Christians are called His disciples, as they profess to learn and receive His doctrines and precepts. In our society today, we have really wandered from this definition.

The Vines Dictionary states that a real disciple of Christ is one who believes in the truth of the Christian religion, and studies to follow the example and obey the precepts of Christ; a believer in Christ is characterized by real respect and honor to God. You can do a search on the internet for a definition of Christian, and you will find results ranging from a person who has received Christian baptism to someone who professes belief in the teachings of Jesus Christ. But as we see in the scriptures, a Christian is defined as a disciple.

In Isaiah 29:13, "The Lord said, 'In as much as these people draw near with their mouths and honor Me with their lips, but have removed their hearts far from Me." This was written to the Jewish people 2,700 years ago, but it could just as well be written today to the church, to those Christians that go to church service each week, but never open a Bible except in service. I attended a Bible College for two years, and I was amazed to see people attending and not bring a Bible. I got to know one man at the beginning and he didn't even own a Bible. Why would you come to a Bible College and not bring a Bible??? What didn't amaze me though, was those same people never finished the school. How serious are you in regards to your Christian walk? Ask yourself, do you fit the scriptural definition of a Christian? Be honest with your answer and determine to make adjustments in your life where it is necessary.

There are many numerous opportunities available to all believers to learn and study. The most obvious is church of course, and there is television, the internet, evangelical meetings, home Bible studies, etc. But within your heart is where it all starts, *Romans 10:9* says, *"If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."* If you don't believe this in your heart, it is for naught. Our heart is where it all happens, not just in our minds. *Proverbs 16:9* tells us, *"A man's heart plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps."* What you choose to believe and what you set your heart towards will exert and exercise tremendous influence on your life, which allows God in turn to mold and shape you. Your heart must cooperate with God's plan for your life, if not Jesus is speaking the same words to us that He spoke to Paul when He said it is hard for you to kick against the pricks.

When your heart is set on the path God has for you, watch and see how good God's life is for you. This is why it is so important to say in your heart, I am going to be a disciple, to be taught and to learn from Jesus Himself. Commit to this, and determine nothing will get in your way. Make a list of those things that interfere in your life with this decision. Secular television? Video games? The wrong kind of friends? Drugs? Porn? Alcohol? Money? Anything that takes your thoughts away from Jesus, those things that you give greater priority to, God should be on this list. These things in the eyes of God are idols and you need to cast them aside. Make being a disciple of Jesus Christ a priority and part of your identity, it's who you are!

As I proceed with defining a disciple of Jesus, bear in mind these are not steps of how to proceed, nor is this an all-inclusive list of what a disciple looks like. I am trying to show you the characteristics of a disciple of Christ, the One we are to look like. I love how my pastor puts it, "But pastor, I want steps. Okay, Step #1: Look at Jesus. Step #2: Keep looking at Jesus. Step #3: Keep on looking at Jesus." It doesn't get any simpler than that. The teachings of Jesus are directed towards everyone, because He intended for us all to be disciples - not just a select few. The points I make here are not in any specific order, except you start in your heart, and commit to being a disciple, to learn of Him through His Holy Spirit.

Scripture can be used to define what and who a disciple is, starting with *Luke 6:40*, "A disciple is not above his tracking, but avaryons who is particulty trained will be like his tracking." So as disciples, you are to be the same as Jesus, and if you never study to know Him, how can you be like Him? When you become like Him, you will love like Him. You will love like Him, because you will have received the revelation of how much He loves you. The original twelve disciples spent over three years with Jesus, traveling with Him, and being taught by Him. Now, you have His same teachings recorded in the Bible and this is essential to start to learn from Him. Next you need the person of the Holy Spirit, for Jesus says in *John 14:26*, "But the Kelper, the Kelp Spirit, when the Pether will send in Kly terms, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you." You need the combination of the Word of God and the Holy Spirit to be a disciple of Jesus, for it is God's Holy Spirit that reveals the mysteries written in His Word. Without the Holy Spirit to teach you understanding, the words of the Bible are only religious philosophy and theology.

This is shown by Paul in *Romans 10:2* where he said of the Jewish people, "For I bear witness, that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge." The Jews did not have the Holy Spirit and they believed the Law was the way to God and salvation, they could not understand God's grace. God's Holy Spirit is who provides revelation and knowledge. Without revelation from His Holy Spirit, I would never have understood His grace and love. Once I truly understood God's grace and what it provided for me, my relationship with God changed completely and forever. With every revelation from God's Holy Spirit, you will have an excitement and joy for God inside of you and it turns you toward a greater desire for Him. You need the Holy Spirit to reveal the deep things of God to you so that you will know the things that have freely been given to you by God. God's Holy Spirit is essential to the disciple, and this is shown in 1 Corinthians 2:9-12, "... Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him. But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God."

These scriptures answered a question that I have been pondering for some time. Jesus had taught several parables one day, and then the disciples came to Him once they were alone and asked Him why He spoke to the people in parables. In continued on page 9 ...

Vraise Reports

I would personally like to thank our Lord and each of you all for helping me along in my journey of 'life' over these past 4

-5 years of my incarceration. Now, I would like for each of you, and our family in Christ, to know that if you are reading these words, then I made my first parole on a 50 year aggravated sentence after serving 25 calendar years! Hallelujah!! Praise Jesus!! I would like for you to print this in the monthly newsletter soon, to bring hope not only to Texas offenders but also to all my other brothers and sisters out there within the prison system. You all are not alone or forgotten by me and especially not our Father in heaven ... T.T.

I am totally blessed by God! I'll share a small praise report with you. It has to do with fighting the Social Security Administration for six years over my disability back pay that was owed to me prior to my incarceration. I prayed over the last letter that I sent them in January 2020, then I put it in the mail. When I didn't get a response to that letter, I began to lose faith that God even existed or heard my prayers. Then on April of this year, I received a letter from Social Security stating that someone who had never reviewed my case, looked into it and granted me my back pay! God does exist and He does hear and answer our prayers, in His own time. Praise God! I believe He seen that I was losing faith and showed me that no matter what the circumstances. He is a

just and loving God who cares for His children ... W.D.

I had the prison reform organization 'START' contact me recently and wanted me to give them some input into the penal system, so I wrote them back with 8 pages of 'The Evolution of the Prison' system. I took them from the 1960's to the present day. Then they asked me if it was okay for them to put this information on line and share it with some reporters. I also shared some of my poetry with them. Anyways, after writing them it triggered a lot of memories which led me to write another poem "The Beast", which I'm including after this article.

They were talking to me about the drug problem in this country, as one of the problems which is true. I told them that when I was using drugs everything was controlled by the Irish-Italian gangsters and they kept it contained to the inner city black neighborhoods. But now 'The Beast' has broken from its cage and everyone wants to 'Reform' it and put it back in its cage! It, as you all know, has found its way into the suburbs and upper middle class - every social and class of people have now been affected by the drug problem in this country today, in one form or another.

But truth be told, It's not a drug problem or a social problem ... It's a Spiritual Problem! That dear brothers and sisters is the root of mankind's problems. It's NOT just a drug problem. Until people grab hold of the Anchor, Jesus, that holds all things steady and come to the Cross they're NEVER going to be totally free! As children of the Light, all we can do is to be that beacon of light for them, helping guide them and covering them in prayer until they too come to the end of themselves and their senses. The only issue there is, they have to have the desire to do so.

Some of us have already experienced for ourselves and know better than most, the lies that satan uses when it comes to drug addiction AND everything that comes along with that lifestyle. Many people have said a lot of things in our lifetimes about 'who' they thought they were in their sight. In His Service By M.D.

Let me begin with Romans 12:1, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." In this appeal the Apostle Paul urges us to have our lives measure up to our beliefs. He says that we are to dedicate everything about ourselves to God - not just our possessions, money, time, energy and efforts, but also our bodies, heads, hands, tongues and yes even our minds, emotions and attitudes. Paul shows us here that the doctrine of justification by faith will not allow laxity or laziness in life or conduct. We are to dedicate everything about ourselves as a "living sacrifice" holy, devoted, consecrated and pleasing to Him. This is our rational, logical intelligent act of worship.

We are saved to serve!! The Christian life must be lived in its relation to God, self and others. Often we get the impression that to totally serve God and worship Him means to involve our body and spirit, but there is more! Here Paul says that we are to serve and worship Him with our minds and emotions also. Invite God to think and speak through you. You can even serve God with your face by smiling and being friendly to other people. Allow God to use ALL of you. The more of yourself you release to Him the more you will be fulfilled and experience His peace and joy. It may surprise you to find out that up to this point we have not had to do a thing but believe in Christ and yield ourselves to Him to use as He wills.

Now - we are to serve, and our Christian service may be in any of several places: In church - (*Romans 12:3-8*) In government - (*Romans 13:1-14*) In disputed things - (*Romans 14 -15:3*) The whole world - (*Romans 15:4-13*). Until we have been saved by His grace and transformed by His love, we can do little for God. (Read the whole Chapter of *1 Corinthians 13*) But when we present ourselves to Christ and become filled with His love, we can find a lot to do. Especially in this den of iniquity we find ourselves in. Christ wants a "living sacrifice" NOT a dead one (*Romans 12:1*).

Many will die in Christ, few will live for Him. Many of you might rather be burned at the stake than face ridicule from the homies or people you know. One definition of a modern Christian is: "A person who will die for the church he or she will not attend." How many of us say nothing when Christ's name is brought up or used in vain?! Wherever you see a need, if you can take care of it - DO IT!

Share an encouraging word, always intercede in prayer for those in need. Anything you can do to help your fellow man -DO IT! That is a "living sacrifice". Jesus gives us an example to follow of a "living sacrifice" in the *John 13:1-17*. It's when He washes the disciples feet. I encourage you all to read it for yourselves. Overcomers, let others see Jesus in you my friends, they may never see Jesus except for what they see in us. Live for Him! Then and only then will you be ready to die for Him.

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Foot's Bible Study Rotes

Isaiah 62:7-66:24

Sin makes us unclean so that we cannot approach God (*Romans 3:23*) any more than a beggar in filthy rags could dine at a king's table. Our best efforts are still infected with sin. Our only hope, therefore, is faith in Jesus Christ who can cleanse use and bring us into God's presence. Read *Romans 3*. (64:6)

God will always preserve a faithful remnant of His people. No matter how bad the world is, there are always a few who remain loyal to Him. Jesus made this point in *Matthew* 13:36-43. (65:8-9)

These key verses summarize Isaiah's message. He contrasted humble persons, who have a profound reverence for God's messages and their application to life with those who choose their own ways. The sacrifices of the arrogant were only external compliance. In their hearts they were murderers, perverts, and idolaters. God shows mercy to the humble, but He curses the proud and self-sufficient. See *Luke 1:51-53*. Our society urges us to be assertive and to affirm ourselves. Don't let your freedom and right to choose lead you away from God's pathway to eternal life. *(66:2-3)*

Philippians 2:19-4:23

The Bible is our safeguard both morally and theologically. When we read it individually and publicly in church, it alerts us to corrections we need to make in our thoughts, attitudes and actions. (3:1)

After Paul considered everything he had accomplished in his life, he said that it was all worthless when compared with the greatness of knowing Christ. This is a profound statement about values. A person's relationship with Christ is more important than anything else. To know Christ should be our ultimate goal. Consider your values. Do you place anything above your relationship with Christ? If your priorities are wrong. How will you reorder them? (3:8)

How do we stay true to the Lord? This refers to what Paul has just taught in *Philippians 3:20-21*. The way to stay true is to keep our eyes on Christ, to remember that this world is not our home, and to focus on the fact that Christ will bring everything under His control. (4:1)

When we give to those in need, it not only benefits the receiver but it benefits us as well. It was not the Philippian gift but their spirit of love and devotion that Paul appreciated the most. (4:17)

Psalm 73:1-74:23

Don't let your life's goals be so unreal that you awaken too late and miss the reality of God's truth. Happiness and hope can be a reality, but only when they are based on God. We should get as close to Him as we can in order to be realistic about life. (73:20)

God's anger against Israel had grown hot during the many years of their sin and idolatry. His patience endured for generations, but at last it was set aside for judgment. If you fall into sin but quickly seek God's forgiveness, His mercy may come quickly and His anger may leave quickly. If you persist in sinning against Him, don't be surprised when His patience runs out. (74:1-2)

Proverbs 24:21-22

Never knowing where the punishment from the Lord will end, we should keep a healthy fear of the Lord and not get involved in the behaviors of evil people. (24:21-22)

Hey ya'll, as a race of humanity we are going through difficult times or even uncharted territory. That being said, we are people of God and as followers of God's Word we are told that in the end we all will be well.

Your Calling - Part 1 By Vern Deadmond

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Matthew 13:11 Jesus replied, "Bacanase it has been given to you to know the mystarias of the kingdom of Heaven, but to them it has not been given." About a year ago I had been reading this scripture, and the Holy Spirit stopped me and asked who is Jesus talking to? I responded, He is talking to His disciples. The light bulb went on above my head, and I realized Jesus is speaking to all His disciples, not just the twelve disciples. (Side note here - this is why it's important not just to read the Bible, but to be listening and talking with the Holy Spirit as you read the Bible, He will reveal these mysterles.) Jesus said it has been given to all His disciples to know the mysteries of God. At that moment, I received this revelation that those who are called to be disciples (that's every born-again believer, you and me) have something inside of them to be able to understand the things of God. What is that something? Remember earlier, I stated we are all called to be disciples the moment we receive Jesus.

So when you received Jesus, it was given to you to be able to understand the Bible as you read it. But if you never read the Bible, how will you ever comprehend or understand the Word of God? You have within you something that allows you to know, understand, and receive revelation as you read the Bible. Many times I have listened to people use the excuse that they don't read the Bible because they don't understand it. Well first, if they are not born-again, of course they will not understand the Scriptures because it has not been given to them to understand them. This is confirmed in 1 Corinthians 2:14. "But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him, nor can he know them, because they are spiritual," not understanding the Bible, they are saying something that just is not true. They only need to ask God to give them understanding. Matthew 7:7-8 says, "Ask, and it will be given to your seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks (Inds, and to him who knocks it will be opened." There, I have just removed your excuse for not reading and studying the Bible. Before you begin to read the Bible (each day), pray to the Father and ask Him to give you understanding and revelation by His Holy Spirit, in the name of Jesus. Amen. But you say, I don't have His Holy Spirit in me. I call BS, that's Bologna Sandwich for your carnal thinking people. 1 Corinthians 3:16 says, "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" So every born-again believer has God's Holy Spirit inside of them. And if when you read the Bible and you don't understand something, you only need to ask God through His Holy Spirit to help your understanding. So back to my question I was asking God, what is the "it" given to me, a disciple, so that I know and understand His mysteries? "It" is His Holy Spirit.

To be a disciple of Jesus, you must be "self-less", denying yourself as you pursue and follow after Him as it says in *Matthew 16:24, "Then Jesus said to His disciples, If anyone dealtres to come after life, let him damy himself, and take up his cross, and follow life,"* You must be willing to say no to your 'self', for you were bought for a great price and then made free. And with the freedom, you are not to abuse the power you now have in Christ. Look at Jesus always, and His grace teaches you to deny any ungodliness. Your 'self' is so consumed with your self, you think and say, "What about me?" 'Self' is what causes you to think everything you have is because you work so hard, you have because you have earned it, and you have because you made it happen. 'Self' keeps you from seeking after God. Why is this? Because 'self' will exalt its feelings and desires above anything and everything, above what God desires for you. You believe you won't have unless you make it happen. 'Self' causes you to focus on you always, and not on God.

Think about how you came to Christ, how you received Him - you confessed and admitted to God that your goodness and righteousness falls way short of meeting His requirement and you need Jesus. You don't need more of 'you'. My mom's second husband refused the free gift of salvation in the last month of his life. He laid on his bed dying of lung cancer, and proclaimed he was going to Heaven because he was not a bad man, 'his' goodness was all he needed to not go to hell. The last moments of his life, terror gripped him, his appearance when death took him shook my mom to her core. She never forgot the look on his face as he passed away. I wonder what he saw as he died? It wasn't Jesus, if he saw Jesus he would have had peace at his death, not terror. But his 'self' kept him from receiving Jesus even when he knew he would not live much longer, he believed in 'his' ability not in Christ's. When you deny your 'self', you admit you can do nothing of your 'self', it is all Jesus inside of you.

In John 5:19, Jesus explained "West assurably, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He saes the Pather do; for whatever No does, the Son also does in the manner." Jesus humbled His 'self' to do only what He saw God the Father do, and you, as a humble disciple, should do what you see Jesus do. This is because you are like Him, you are a "little Christ", which is what the term Christian means. When you are humble, you say to Jesus, "I need you, I can do nothing without you, I know you have my back." But selfish pride says, "Jesus, I got this, it's all good, I have it covered." God is not opposing the humble, He is for you. It is only when you let your 'self' get in the way that you feel like He is not helping you. That is because you are telling Him I don't need Your help, I can take care of it. James 4:6 tells us, "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble." As long as you think you have any situation handled in your strength, God's hands are tied by your pride. But those who call out to God and ask Him for assistance with the attitude, "I can't do this Lord, help me," God rushes in with His grace. As long as you say in your mind," I can do this," you are at odds with God.

Paul tells us in *Romans 8:7, "The carnal mind is enmity against God; for it is not subject to the law of God, nor indeed can be."* When you make any situation about you, you are thinking carnally, you might as well be nicknamed 'meat-head'. When your thinking is all about you, how you have been wronged or your focus and attention is how do you get more for your 'self', your mind is in opposition to God. Change your thinking. Instead of thinking about what 'you' have to do to make it through your day, start thanking God for teaching you, for giving you wisdom, and providing for you. And don't seek God for what He will give you, but seek God for the relationship and fellowship you will have with Him. A true disciple of Jesus Christ is humble and thinks only of how he can serve God. He will lay aside any offense or wrong that has been inflicted upon him or her.

No wrong ever done to us is greater than the wrong that man has done to God. What do I mean by this? Jesus was betrayed by man and He was beaten to the point that He was unrecognizable. He was spit on, stripped naked, nailed to a cross, and put on display until He said it is finished and He gave up His spirit. At any time He could have called out to God the Father, and said, "Father, man doesn't deserve what I am doing for him. Look what they have done to Me. Send Your angels and take Me down, and rain fire and brimstone down upon them. Kill them all, and let them receive the judgment worthy of their sin, for they do not deserve Your mercy and grace." But we all know that is not what Jesus said, instead He said, as is recorded in *Luke 23:34, "Fathar, farging them, for they do not deserve* Your mercy and grace." But we all know that is not what Jesus, instead of allowing 'self' to be elevated for the wrongs done to Him, choose to deny Himself and forgive man-kind for all the wrongs we have done to Him. I've associated with people that would have thrown a punch for far less worse done to them. As a whole, man-kind has no excuse for retribution or revenge, there is no wrong that has been done to us than that which is greater than what we have done to Him. A real and true disciple lay's down those wrongs which have been inflicted on them, they deny 'self' the right to make a wrong right. And a disciple does not allow themselves to be deceived by man-kind, and pick up someone else's offense or wrong that was never done to them.

Jesus warns 'us', in *Matthew 24:4*, that at the end of the age to, "Table head that no one deceives you," I say 'us', because He was answering a direct question from His disciples. Don't let the media confuse and deceive you at this time, let the Word of God be your compass. The Word of God is the real truth, anything else put forth is false and a counterfeit. All of 'us' disciples who are grounded in God's Word will not be deceived.
