

Don't Be Anxious

“When I am afraid, I will trust in you” (Psalm 56:3).

In Matthew 6:25-33, Jesus speaks passionately about the need to rely on Father's loving care: “Do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add one cubit to his span of life? . . . Therefore do not be anxious...”

Anxiousness is running rampant, but I heard, “Get ready to be amazed.” He wants to break off anxiousness in others through you. As you put your hope and confidence in Him, you will see even Him do more things you have never seen. Anxiousness does not have to rule hearts of those you love (or in you). What you have been seeing has challenged you in many ways. This season has been unlike others you've been in.

You definitely have not walked this way before. But God says, “Your past experiences and challenges have strengthened you. You are ready for this.” You are ready to see things you've not seen before. Don't allow discouragement to distract you. God is in these times. God is in the things you are seeing, and He is at work. You must wait on Him to see what He does. Anxiousness and doubt are trying to thwart your trust in Him.

You must stay on the path He has put before you. You cannot let these days cause you to stumble. You must hold tight to your trust in Him. 2 Samuel 7:28 says, “Sovereign LORD, you are God! Your covenant is trustworthy, and you have promised these good things to your servant.” God is raising the stakes. Pay attention, there are coming more opportunities for you His anointing to move through you as His Spirit leads you.

He is directing your steps along these paths. You are part of the process to help others reach a destination in Him. There is no need to worry or to have regrets about your past. These are days in which circumstances will define to others who you are in Him. Keep seeking first His kingdom. Keep seeking His righteousness. Keep sharing His love to those around you and watch GOD change them.
