Interview of the Month: - Roger Bale



I was a big fan of harmonica music in the 50s – The Harmonicats, Johnny Puleo, Richard Hayman, Leo Diamond, etc. All of them played chromatic, so when I decided to learn to play, naturally I chose the chromatic. I loved the big band music of the 40s and the pop music of the 50s, so that's what I learned to play.

I learned to play by ear, and that worked for a lot of music, but I soon discovered that there were some pieces of music that I just couldn't pick up by ear, so I taught myself to read music. That was a tedious and difficult process,

but it was well worth it because now I can play any piece of music that isn't technically too difficult for my skill set.

In January of 2001, I discovered Mile High Harmonica Club and SPAH. I have been an active member of both organizations ever since. I developed a computerized membership and convention registration system for SPAH, and I served as membership director for about twelve years. I also built an early version of the SPAH website and published *Harmonica Happenings* magazine for about four years.

With MHHC I played for several years with the ensemble group, Harp'n Harmonicas (Later named the West Wind Harmonica Band) under the direction of Betty Taylor. I want to thank Betty for her tireless and skilled work in arranging music and directing the band. My time with that group helped me to learn music theory and develop my playing skills.
