Rules and Regulations

- Respect hours of operation. No one on property after 5:30pm. (unless arrangements made prior)
- All riders, guests, and horse owner must sign a release form.
- Wear an ASTM/SEI certified helmet is mandatory for 18 and under.
- All children must be supervised.
- Don't use others' property.
- Horses not in full or half training must have their own saddles, bridles, saddle pads, and other tack marked clearly with horse or owners name.
- Do not leave your tack in crosstie areas. Please put away properly.
- Clean up poop left by your horse.
- Close all gates and stall doors.
- No Smoking near any buildings. Smoke in designated areas ONLY!
- Dogs must be on leash, confined, or in a dog area
- Do not feed horses other than your own.
- If you are unsure of what you are doing, ask for help.
- Never enter a stall/paddock other than your horse's without permission except in an emergency situation.
- Always have a halter or bridle on your horse. Hold or tie the horse. Horses may not be loose.
- Do not mount or ride in the barn.
- If your horse is not in full training or half training and you do not make it out regularly (2-3 times a week) you will be charged a handling fee every time a staff member does anything such a groom, exercise, hold for vet or farrier, or bathe your horse. Out of town arrangements can be made.
- Your account must be in good standing before booking a lesson.
- Promises Ranch enforces a strict cancellation policy. Any student who fails to attend a lesson without notice of cancelation is considered a "no show" and will be charged the full price if horse/horses are not in full or half training.
- Tacking up is a part of horsemanship and therefore a significant part of your lesson. If an individual cannot tack or un-tack the horse, we will do our best to have a staff member to help you. Once you have been approved to tack your horse independently, please arrive early to get your horse ready.
- If you are late for your lesson time, you will not get your full lesson.
- Rules and regulations are in place for the safety of all riders and horses. Failure to comply may result in your being asked to leave the barn. A verbal warning, will be followed by a written warning, followed by dismissal from the ranch.
