

Performs other related duties as required.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Knowledge of safety practices and procedures; department policies and procedures; wastewater treatment plant operating procedures; wastewater treatment regulations; basic mechanical maintenance; grounds maintenance and repair.

Ability to carry out instructions in written, oral, or picture form; deal with problems involving several variables within familiar context; define problems, collect data, establish facts, and draw valid conclusions; prepare accurate documentation; recognize safety warnings; understand technical manuals and/or verbal instructions; cooperate with co-workers on group projects; perform light manual labor; travel to and gain access to work site.

Licensure or Certification Requirements:

Completion of secondary education (high school or GED) and prior training or experience as a wastewater treatment plant operator, or equivalent. Applicants with college level training may be preferred.

Possession of a valid State of Ohio driver's license, must be able to qualify for and remain insurable under the City's vehicle insurance policy. Must possess a state issued wastewater operator's license.

Equipment Operated:

Computer, front-end loader, skid loader, tractor, dump truck, power, bench and hand tools.

Inherently hazardous or physically demanding working conditions:

Is exposed to environmental conditions which may result in injury from fumes, odors, dusts, mists, hazardous gases and waste, chemicals, flammables, unsanitary conditions and air contaminants in poorly ventilated work areas.

Is exposed to noisy conditions above 85db;

Works in vicinity of floor or wall openings, elevated platforms, and/or runways;

Is exposed to possible injury when ascending and/or descending ladders, stairs, or scaffolds;

Works on and around powered platforms and/or vehicle mounted platforms and therefore is exposed to possible injury as a result of working with moving mechanical parts of equipment or machines;

Is exposed to possible injury as a result of electrical shock;

Has exposure to hot, cold, wet, humid, or windy weather conditions;

Lifts and carries in excess of fifty (50) pounds of weight.

In accordance with the U.S. Department of Labor exertion levels, this is considered heavy work.
