

Woycik, Beatrice

Miss Beatrice Woycik, 81, of rural Parisville, beloved sister, godmother and friend, passed away Tuesday morning, February 24, 2004, at Courtney Manor of Bad Axe following a brief illness. Beatrice was born July 30, 1922 in Paris Township, Huron County, where she resided for 50 years of her life. She was the daughter of the late Thomas L. and Ida (Wodwaski) Woycik. Beatrice attended the Duda School in Sigel Township and graduated from the Grace School in Paris Township. She was employed at Chrysler Corporation in Detroit from 1942 until she retired in 1973 after 31 years of service. She was a lifelong member of St. Mary Catholic Church in Parisville and the Holy Rosary Sodality of the church. She was a member of the Bad Axe Daughters of Isabella Fidelis Regina Circle No. 608. She was preceded in death by her parents; and two brothers, Joseph, in 1982, and Frank, in 1989. A funeral mass will be at 11 a.m. on Saturday, February 28, 2004, at St. Mary Catholic Church in Parisville. The Rev. Andrzej Boroch, pastor, will officiate. Burial will be in the church cemetery in the spring. Visitation will be from 6:30 to 9 p.m. today, 3 to 9 p.m. on Friday, and from 9 to 10 a.m. on Saturday at the Zinger-Smigielski Funeral Home of Ubly.
