The Treasure Coast Youth Symphony is composed of the most talented young musicians, selected by audition from Indian River, St. Lucie, Martin and northern Palm Beach counties. The orchestra performs standard and classical literature, as well as modern transcriptions of Broadway scores. With the 2016-2017 season, the orchestra is celebrating twenty-nine years of music on the Treasure Coast.

The mission of the Treasure Coast Youth Symphony is to provide challenging experiences in orchestral and individual performance for student musicians, to broaden technical skills and artistic expression, to instill professionalism, and to enhance enjoyment of their musical talents for themselves and for their audiences.

An invaluable asset to the community the Treasure Coast Youth Symphony offers many benefits to its young musicians, their families and audiences. As an independent private non-profit organization, it makes available an advanced level supplement to music education in our schools by providing musician members with orchestral performance experiences and the opportunity to play full, original scores – the same music played by professional orchestras.

The Treasure Coast Youth Symphony affords the opportunity for students to perform for live audiences at professional venues such as the Lyric Theatre in Stuart, the Eissey Campus Theatre in Palm Beach Gardens, and the Waxlax Center for the Performing Arts in Vero Beach. A concerto contest held annually for Treasure Coast Youth Symphony musicians provides solo performance experience with orchestral accompaniment.

The Treasure Coast Youth Symphony awards scholarships and grants to qualifying students to continue their music education during a summer music program of their choice or to assist in the expense of music lessons or instrument maintenance.

A valuable enhancement for college applications, the orchestral experience provides additional impetus for financial assistance, scholarships, and grants by colleges, universities and/or conservatories. Participation in the youth symphony gives evidence to the discipline, accomplishment and teamwork characteristic of our orchestra members.

The Treasure Coast Youth Symphony is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization and obtains funding through orchestra member dues, private contributions and performance revenues. The conductors, musicians, and families spend countless volunteer hours managing, rehearsing and supporting the activities of the symphony.

He has been a member of the National Honor Society in high school and consistently volunteers in several churches in the area. He enjoys sharing his talent as part of his church's praise team, and also teaches younger students to develop their cello skills. His future plans include a career in music and business. John Enyart, Phd.

(Founder, Treasure Coast Youth Symphony 1987)

Dr. Enyart. The founder of the Treasure Coast Youth Symphony, has served in multiple music education positions since receiving his bachelor's, master's and doctorate degrees in Musicology and Music Theory from the Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati. His area of study included intense concentration in violin and conducting. He also holds a Bachelor of Theology degree from God's Bible College where he later became Chairman of the Music Department of that institution. Dr. Enyart was a member of the graduate faculty at the University of Cincinnati and has served as Chairman of the Music Department of the Hobe Sound Bible College, Hobe Sound, Florida. Most recently Dr. Enyart served as Director of Musical Ministries at the Morningside Friends Church in Port St. Lucie.

While at the University of Cincinnati Dr. Enyart was Concertmaster of the concert orchestra and principal second of the philharmonic orchestra. In addition, he held positions as Concertmaster of both the Hamilton Symphony and Middleton Symphony Orchestras and has played with the Atlantic Classical Orchestra of Vero Beach and Stuart. Dr. Enyart continues his involvement in music education teaching violin lessons to community students and conducting for the Treasure Coast Youth Symphony.

Benjamin Enyart

Benjamin Enyart began studying the violin at age five. When he joined the Treasure Coast Youth Symphony in the eighth grade he realized his love of music and violin which led him to his pursuit of higher levelmusical studies. He attended Bob Jones University where he completed both a bachelor's and master's degree in music.

Throughout Mr. Enyart's university days, he performed with the university symphony and string quartet. Mr. Enyart taught at the Berean Christian School in West Palm Beach where he worked at developing a string program. Presently, Mr. Enyart teaches at the Morningside Academy in Port St. Lucie, Florida and currently directs the middle and high school orchestras. He performs as soloist in various venues, plays in the Enyart String Quartet and the Morningside Church Orchestra.


Thomas Servinsky

(Founder, The Academy Orchestra 2010)

With parents who were both teachers and a father who was a very talented clarinetist, Mr. Servinsky's inherited interest in music and and talent in clarinet led him to his studies at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Mr. Servinsky further studied in Paris with Maurice Gabai, principal clarinetist with the Paris Opera, with Louis Paul, principal clarinetist of the Pittsburgh Symphony, and with Stanley Drucker, principal clarinetist with the New York Philharmonic.

Mr. Servinsky has played with the Atlantic Classical Orchestra for over twentyfive seasons, and free lances with several south Florida orchestras and opera companies. He has six recordings under the Citadel Label as assistant concert master with the Keystone Wind Ensemble. Including the entire William Schuman wind ensemble collection and the entire Leroy Anderson collection. In addition to performing, Mr. Servinsky teaches private clarinet to advanced students throughout the Treasure Coast.

A graduate of the Chautauqua Institute Piano Technology program with over 30 years as a Registered Piano Technician, Mr. Servinsky's rebuilt pianos have been hailed by Victor Borge, Peter Nero, Roger Williams, and the Beaux Art Trio. Mr. Servinsky has traveled world-wide as the personal piano technician for artists such as Ryuchi Sakamoto and John O'Connor, and is on staff as one of the Steinway Concert Technicians for south Florida.
