## **City of Demopolis Fireworks Ordinance**

Sec. 10-4. - Fireworks.

(a)It shall be unlawful for the citizens of this city, or any person or corporation engaged in business to sell at retail any fireworks permitted by state law. Proof of permit from the state fire marshal and a business license and permit from the city is required for each stand, trailer or facility from which fireworks sales are permitted as provided in this article.(b)Common class C fireworks as defined by the U.S. Department of Transportation may be sold and discharged within the city limits and police jurisdiction of the city only during the dates and times specified herein.(1)Beginning June 20 and ending on July 10 and beginning December 15 and ending January 2 of each year.(2)The time period for the [sale] of fireworks shall be from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight each day during the specified dates, provided that no fireworks are sold between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m.(3)The time period for discharging fireworks shall be from 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. each day during the specified dates, provided that no fireworks are discharged between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.(4)Special provisions for New Years Eve will apply to the hours of discharging which will be until 1:00 a.m. on New Years Day only.(c)The city council may grant special permission for fireworks special event displays during any date or time only upon written application for said permit and business license, submitted fifteen (15) days prior to the scheduled date of such event. The granting of such special permit shall be conditioned upon the approval of the city fire department, police department and building official.(d)Any individual, firm, partnership or corporation that violates any provisions of this article shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned for not less than thirty (30) days or both in the discretion of the court.
