## Being a Committed Steward

Through the work of the Holy Spirit, we become committed stewards, who use our time, talents, and resources to help and serve others, build God's Church, and expand His kingdom. Even though you and I are undeserving, God honors us with the privilege of being His stewards.

- In Genesis 1:28, we learn that God gives us dominion over all His creation.
- In Genesis 2:15, we are given the task of tending and caring for what He has created.

In Psalms 8:6, we read that God has made us overseers and rulers over the works of His hands.

God's Word gives us our authority, responsibility, privilege, and duty to be stewards of His creation. Our stewardship is to reflect the same love and concern that God has for all He has created.

As stewards, we are managers or caretakers, not owners of all that God entrusts to us. He has created and still owns and sustains all things. Everything we have is His. Faithful stewards remember that all we have and all we are is because of God. In Psalm 24:1 we read, "The earth is the LORD's..." We are God's stewards entrusted with the management of the world. On our own, we are incapable of becoming stewards, but we have been reconciled to God through Christ's life, death, and resurrection making us new creations. God becomes the source of our strength. We become His hands, feet, and mouth, as He works through us in our stewardship. As faithful stewards, our acts of stewardship are efforts that always seek to praise God.

By God's grace, we become committed stewards who are faithful, prayerful, grateful, generous, and service-oriented. Being committed stewards implies that our stewardship is not a part-time position. It is our whole life response to God's grace and love. It is much more than helping our neighbors occasionally or placing an offering in the collection plate. Living with the perspective of being stewards changes our lives. Being stewards is what we are, which determines what we do. "And whatever you do, in word and deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17). We are called to be stewards in our homes, neighborhoods, schools, and workplaces. God wants us to use our time, talents, and resources for His glory. Blessings on your stewardship journey!

Pastor O.F. Pittack, of much renown, was installed in 1952 and continued to serve the congregation until his death in 1975.1967 saw the breaking of ground and the laying of the cornerstone of a new education wing, which was completed in 1968. Pastor Dwight Rengstorf came in 1975 and served until 1986.

During his tenure the "new" parsonage was built in 1976. Rev. Loren Vogler came in 1986 and served until his retirement in 2002. Pastor Todd Bunge was called in 2002 serving until 2016. Since 2017 Pastor Joshua Lowe has served Trinity.

On June 22, 2024 devastating flood destroyed the basements of both the church fellowship hall, Sunday school rooms, and the parsonage along with the homes of several members, as well as the West end of Hawarden. Since that time, God has blessed Trintiy with tremendous generosity and the faithful service of members and volunteers who have worked tirelessly to restore the damage. The parsonage was rededicated in January 2025 and we anticipate the fellowship hall and Sunday School wing will be rededicated in the summer.

Throughout this history God has been faithful by calling, gathering, enlightening, sanctifying, and keeping His people in Jesus Christ and His one, holy, Christian, and apostolic church. While much of Trinity's history is documented through the service of pastors and the building of buildings, it is God's faithful people who have served, given, shared, nurtured, and carried out the great work of God in Christ throughout the Hawarden community. This is our history, but is the Lord's work. With the Psalmist we say: "This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes" (Psalm 118:23). Thanks be to God!

### Trinity 125

Trinity moves into our 125th year of God's grace by reviewing our history in this newsletter edition. Please look forward to upcoming events currently in the works throughout this year.

History is important because it tells the story of people and places. Throughout the Bible God's story is told through people and places. His story in the Bible had a purpose, one purpose- to save a fallen world from their sins through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. But this one purpose resulted in God's family formed in creation, redeemed in Jesus, to now live in this world hearing and doing His Word while anticipating the new world to come. History teaches us man's ambitions, achievements, and failures, and God's continual, providential hand at work always moving creation forward to eternity.

125 years ago history happened when German immigrant farmers from St. Paul's, Ireton decided they needed a church of their own, closer to home in Hawarden. In 1900 five members left Ireton established Trinity Lutheran Church on July 17, 1900. They were Wilhelm Uffken, Herman Witt Sr, Carl Johnson, John Rehmsted, and Adolph Witt. They enlisted Rev. Hugo Grimm form Ireton conducted services in various venues until members purchased the Calliope Methodist Church and moved it to what is now the north end of the current parking lot. Trinity called its own, first pastor in 1905- Walter C. Rehwaldt, a graduate from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

Trinity's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was a big event with neighboring congregations all gathering together for one big service under the care of Trinity's second pastor, Rev. George Steinkamp who came to the congregation in 1915 and remained 1937. In 1937 Charles A. Burkhart was installed. Pastor Burkhart served until 1947 when he died of a heart attack. Two years later in 1949 a new pastor was called, Rev. H.E. Sieving who led the congregation through the building of the current church in 1950. On February 25, 1951 the congregation celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary by dedicating its new house of worship.
