The November tournaments were scheduled for November the 6th a wildcard and November 12th on Ouachita. Best producing baits were a green pumpkin trick worm on a jig head ,Carolina rig (lower left) Other baits that were successful included a darter head jig with a salt and pepper dead ringer, top water, drop shot and Alabama rig.

The top three Anglers for the November wildcard tournament were: Greg Osterhout with 172 ounces, Jim Gardner with 140 ounces and Dave Keith with 105 ounces. On the co-angler side the top three were: Paul Galfund with 92 ounces, Larry Ivens with 60 ounces and Pete DeVries with 53 ounces.

Big bass on the Angler side was Greg Osterhout with 76 ounces. Big bass on the co-angler side was a tie between Paul Galfund and Larry Ivens with 34 ounces.

The top three anglers for the November Ouachita tournament were: Dave Keith with 186 ounces, Kirk Bixler with 154 ounces and Fred Chapmen with 87 ounces. On the co-angler side the top three were: Pete DeVries with 99 ounces, Jim Retzer with 79 ounces and Larry Ivens with 60 ounces.
