
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Miami Art Week

Adam Straus' paintings are easy to like. They're romantic, lovely, and gentle... But they're also funny. Straus paints nature with a deft hand, his rippling waves catching the glowing twilight of the sun on clouds, just so. It's peaceful, *Shared Air* (above), as well as being a biting commentary on how remiss we are to just enjoy what we see in the moment, instead of framing it through an i-thing.

Straus was born in Miami in 1956, but lives and works in Long Island. He is the focus of a major one-person exhibition at *PULSE Miami Beach*, after having been nominated earlier this year for *The PULSE Prize*: a jury-awarded cash grant for an artist of distinction showing a solo exhibition at the fair.

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
