

Chief's Corner



Springtime is here, along with that comes longer days and warmer weather. People are out enjoying the springtime, walking the dogs and riding bikes. Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in criminal activity, specifically vehicle burglaries and vandalism. With very little time and effort, you can make a huge difference in your vulnerability to vehicle burglary and auto theft.

VEHICLE BURGLARY Always close and lock your windows and doors. Park in well-lit areas. Set your vehicle alarm. Do not leave belongings in your vehicle—if you do, make sure they are locked and out of plain sight. Do not leave personal information in your vehicle. Do not put your home address in your GPS unit.

Most Common Items Stolen:

GPS units, cell phones, purses, laptops, gym bags, backpacks, loose change, stereos, CDs

VEHICLE THEFT If possible park your vehicle in your garage and lock the garage door. Never leave your vehicle running or the keys in the ignition. When leaving a vehicle for service, provide only the vehicle key. Use paint or an indelible marker to put the vehicle identification number (VIN) under the



engine hood, trunk lid and on the battery. Also, remember to close your garage doors at night. An open garage door is a lot of temptation to those who are looking to help themselves to your stuff.

We have been successful as a department because of the cooperation we receive from the community. It is through your calls, tips and social media sharing that we can solve a lot of the criminal activity that has taken place recently. THANKS!!

Again, remember to call us if you see any suspicious activity in your area. It may be nothing, but it could be something!!


