Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

- *Exodus 17:8–13* As long as Moses kept his hands raised up,
- *Israel had the better of the fight.*
- *Psalm 121* “Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.”
- *2 Timothy 3:14—4:2* The scriptures train you to stay with the task.
- *Luke 18:1–8* Be persistent in prayer, especially in the pursuit of justice.

The first reading transports us back to Moses’ time, to a battle in which Moses’ stamina was gravely tested. In the second reading, Paul encourages Timothy to be persistent in spreading the Good News.

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples the importance of praying persistently, to keep their faith while continually petitioning God for justice. May we take to heart the words we sing in the psalm today: “Our help is from the Lord.”

Pastor's Reflection

This weekend Pope Leo is canonizing seven new saints. The diversity of this group is remarkable and highlights the universality of the Church:

Bl. Jose Gregorio Hernandez and Bl. Maria del Carmen Rendiles are both from Venezuela. Bl. Jose was a physician who was called the "doctor of the poor" and Bl. Maria was a nun who founded a religious order.

Bl. Ignazio Maloyan, was an Armenian bishop who was killed during the Ottoman genocide.

Bl. Peter To Rot, was a lay catechist from Papua New Guinea, who was martyred during the Japanese occupation in World War II.

Bl. Vincenza Poloni, was from Verona, Italy; a nun who founded a religious order.

Bl. Maria Troncatti, a member of the Salesian Missionaries who worked in Ecuador with indigenous people.

Bl. Bartolo Longo, was an Italian lawyer who was a former Satanic priest. He converted to Catholicism and was incredibly devoted to the rosary, founding the Shrine of Our Lady of the Rosary of Pompeii.

These saints remind us of the vast expanse of God's love and mercy, extending over our entire world. May these saints be models for all of us in our own journey of Faith.


