Brothers and Sisters,

May God's grace give us the necessary joy, peace, and patience to love our neighbors.



Two months ago, we learned about the salvation journey with a detailed analysis of Ephesians 2:8-10. It says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith-- and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-- not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do".

This passage teaches that we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus. To understand salvation, we must study grace.

Grace is the undeserved love of God that is made known to us by the Holy Spirit. It works on our hearts in different ways, depending on where we are on the salvation journey. In other words, there are various 'works of grace': prevenient grace, justifying grace, and sanctifying grace. Last month (February), we studied prevenient grace. This month (March), we explore justifying grace and next month (April), we'll look at sanctifying grace.

So, justifying grace.

God offers us a divine pardon – complete forgiveness. We call this offer justifying grace. God forgives **all** our sins when we receive God's justifying grace.

Unlike the pardons we get from governors or presidents, there will be no public stigma attached to your divine pardon. A divine pardon leaves no paper trail reminding people of past sins. The Book of Life will have your name in it with nothing about the sins for which you received forgiveness.

Although this divine pardon (complete forgiveness) is a gift, acceptance of God's forgiveness entails an admission of guilt and sincere desire to change. This is how repentance fits into our salvation. Repentance is admitting to God that you are a sinner and expressing a sincere desire to change. It generally happens just prior to or during the time we receive God's justifying grace.

Here is the really good news: God offers <u>everyone</u> a divine pardon. This is good news because we all need it. We all "...have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God..." (Romans 3:23). We've all thought, said or done something that is unloving towards God, ourselves and others and this separates ourselves from God. So, we all need this!

We receive this free offer of forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ. We do nothing to earn it. Meditate on Romans 3:21-24, Galatians 2:16 & Galatians 3:26-29. Then talk to God in your own words about receiving it. Justifying grace is that simple.

When we receive God's divine pardon and become justified, we have a new beginning as regenerated people. This is commonly known as being born again (John 3:3). There are four ways in which a justified, or reborn, believer experiences a new beginning.

The first new beginning is eternal life. Eternal life is more than simply existing forever and going to heaven when we die. It is having a never-ending love relationship with God, and it starts the moment we receive justifying grace. (John 17:3)

The second new beginning is a restored loving relationship with God as our perfect Father. Read John 1:12, Romans 8:15-16 and 1 John 3:1. As children of God, we can go to God in prayer and say: "Dad, I need your help", "Dad, I have something to run by you", "Dad, I'm hurting", or "Dad, I love you."

The third new beginning is living as citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven. As justified believers, we live in a sinful and fallen world, but we are not of that world. We become citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven. Read Mark 1:15, Luke 17:20-21, John 17:14-16 & Philippians 3:20.

As citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven, our values run counter to the world's values. The world values money, power and prestige. The Kingdom of Heaven values faith, humility and service. The world relies on might and force. The Kingdom of Heaven relies on faith, love and the Holy Spirit. The world teaches us to love only those who love us back. The Kingdom of Heaven teaches us to love our enemies.

The fourth new beginning is the process to become more like Jesus. This is what enables us to live out Kingdom of Heaven values in this sinful. As we walk in a relationship with God, the Holy Spirit changes our hearts and makes us more like Jesus. This is the goal of the Christian life. (Matthew 5:48, 1 John 3:2 & Ephesians 4:14-15) This process of becoming more like Jesus is called sanctification. The Holy Spirit's Work to bring us through this process is called sanctifying grace. This will be the topic of next week's sermon.

On Sunday, March 23, Burton's United Women in Faith group will hold their annual Call to Prayer and Self Denial Program. All members and visitors to Burton Memorial Church are welcome to attend our free luncheon and program in the church fellowship hall after the worship service. Barbara Koch and Kim Youngblood will be coordinating this event. The March monthly meeting will immediately follow the program. All are welcome to attend the meeting as well.

This year's offering will support economic development, microenterprise projects, and vocational training internationally. It will also be used to support the work of United Methodist conference women's teams that design and lead projects that improve the lives of their local community members. Funds will also support regional missionaries who partner in this work. One hundred percent of this offering goes directly to the focus projects for this year.

In our Call to Prayer Program, we will focus on learning about just one of the supported projects. The Methodist Women's Federation of Peru is joining the United Women in Faith to empower Peruvian women through the Transformative Development Project. Education for women and girls in Peru has been an ongoing struggle for many years. This project is aimed at more than 500 women who are part of 29 women's units of local Methodist churches throughout the country.

Women in every conference of the United Methodist Church gather to pray, learn and give sacrificially to this offering. 

#### **Give Up Something Bad for Lent**

Brothers and Sisters,

May God's grace give us the necessary joy, peace, and patience to love our neighbors.



On March 5, 2025 (Ash Wednesday) we will begin the 40-day season of Lent. This is a time of self-reflection, repentance, and self-denial. These spiritual exercises prepare us for the celebration of Jesus' triumphant resurrection on Easter.

Traditionally, Christians sacrificially give up something enjoyable for Lent. Most Christians give up something like chocolate, caffeine, meat, or television – something they would really miss. This spiritual discipline imitates Jesus' own self-denial and sacrificial love. It helps us to turn toward God and the ways of God.

This year, I propose we do something a little different. In addition to giving up something enjoyable, we also give up something bad for Lent. We'll follow Rev. James Moore's adult Lenten study *Give Up Something Bad for Lent*. He challenges us to give up the actions, attitudes, habits, or sins that keep us from becoming more Christlike. Things like bitterness, apathy, gossip, self-pity, envy, or blaming. As a small group, we will pray and ask God to empower us in this endeavor. We will be successful, but only with God's grace.

Jesus instructed his disciples to deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow him (Matthew 16:24). Denying ourselves means that we get rid of those things in our lives that prevent us from reflecting the light of Christ. This small group Lenten study will help us to do this.

We'll meet every Monday during the 40 days of Lent to discuss how we are doing. Here is the schedule:

- ➤ March 31, 2025 @ 6:30 PM in Joy classroom Give up a bad habit for Lent

- ➤ April 14, 2025 @ 6:30 PM in Joy classroom Wrap your arms around something good for Easter

### Lenten Events to Mark Your Calendar



**Ash Wednesday - Anointing with Ashes** 

**Date**: March 5, 2025, **Time**: 7 am to 9:30 am. **Place**: Drive Thru in front of the Sanctuary

Every year, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and is always 46 days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.

**Ash Wednesday Service** 

**Date**: March 5, 2025, **Time**: 6:00 pm.

**Place**: Sanctuary

During Mass (for Catholics) or worship service (for Protestants), the priest or pastor will usually share a sermon that is penitential and reflective in nature. After this, the congregation will be invited to receive the ashes on their foreheads. Usually, the priest or pastor will dip his finger into the ashes, spread them in a cross pattern on the forehead, and say, "From dust you came and from dust you will return."

#### **April 18, 2025 Worship time: 12:00 pm**


