SR VICE REPORT

Summarv of Kristin Rossi's presentation to the Detachment on May 1st... Parkinson's disease (PD) belongs to a group of conditions called motor system disorders. It is a neurodegenerative disease which is the most common cause of parkinsonism, or the akinetic-rigid svndrome. Parkinson's disease is recognized by the presence of at least three of four cardinal signs:

- Resting tremorCogwheel Rigidity
- (muscle stiffness)Bradykinesia
- (slowness of movement)
- Akinesia (absence of movement)
- Postural instability

Parkinson's disease affects approximately 1.5 million people in the United States and 35,000 here in Michigan.

Although it most commonly affects people over age 60, Parkinson's disease can occur as early as age 20. Whatever your age and stage, we are here for you. Learn more at www.parkinsonsmi.org

Four "pillars" of MPF:

<u>Community</u> - You are not in this alone. With over 70 groups across Michigan, we can connect you with a Parkinson's support group in your area. Explore our community events and volunteering efforts.

Exercise - Exercise is linked to reduced risk of Parkinson's, slower progression, and can help manage symptoms. Join us for free virtual exercise classes six days a week, or take part in our walkathon events.

Education - We are dedicated to spreading awareness and providing educational resources for people with Parkinson's and their families. Request an information packet for guidance on managing Parkinson's Disease.

<u>**Respite</u>** - We provide respite care assistance, medication assistance, care consultations, mindfulness programs, and other resources for caregivers. Our Helpline is available weekdays from 9-5 when you need support.</u>

I asked him what outfit he served with over there, he replied "Sixth Marines". I already knew that the Sixth Marines never served in Vietnam. I thought better than calling him out on his statements, given that he was sitting with his wife and young boys.

I wonder if grandpa regales his grandchildren with stories of his time in the Corps(?)
