Since returning to Colorado, Gale has been involved with the Broomfield Art Guild and Louisville Art Guild. Her artwork will be included in the Spring Membership shows for both organizations, as well as the Anthem Ranch Art Show on June 3-4 at the Aspen Lodge Community Center in Anthem Ranch.

ASTER celebrates the joys of Springtime and being in the garden with this special concert. The title refers to a poem by Robert Frost in which a young girl asks her father "to give her a garden plot to plant and tend and reap herself."

Join us in the garden and you will hear a bird's lullaby, be delighted by a Japanese song about fireflies, and enjoy a Swedish folksong reminding us that "Now is the time for living."

The centerpiece of ASTER's April concert is American Composer Vincent Persichetti's *Spring Cantata* which is set to the poetry of E.E. Cummings. By turns that are mystical and playful, it will be further enhanced by Sara Love's reading of these poems.

ASTER will offer selections from *The Secret Garden* by composer Lucy Simon. "We hope that these pieces will bring back memories of reading that timeless classic when you were young or seeing the musical when it toured the country in the 1990s," explained Dr. Christina Lynn-Craig, ASTER's founder and Artistic Director.

Other music in the concert will include *Morning Has Broken*, The Real Group's *Bumblebee*, the Andrews Sisters' *Don't Sit Under the Apple Tree*, and *Over the Rainbow*.

The Broomfield Art Guild continues its efforts to recruit new members, discover new opportunities to display the artwork of its members, and explore the creation of art at its monthly meetings.

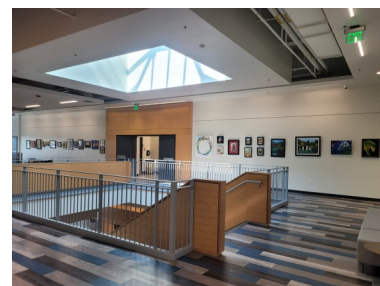
Since last year, its membership has nearly doubled. To see the artwork of many of its talented members, visit the following exhibits:

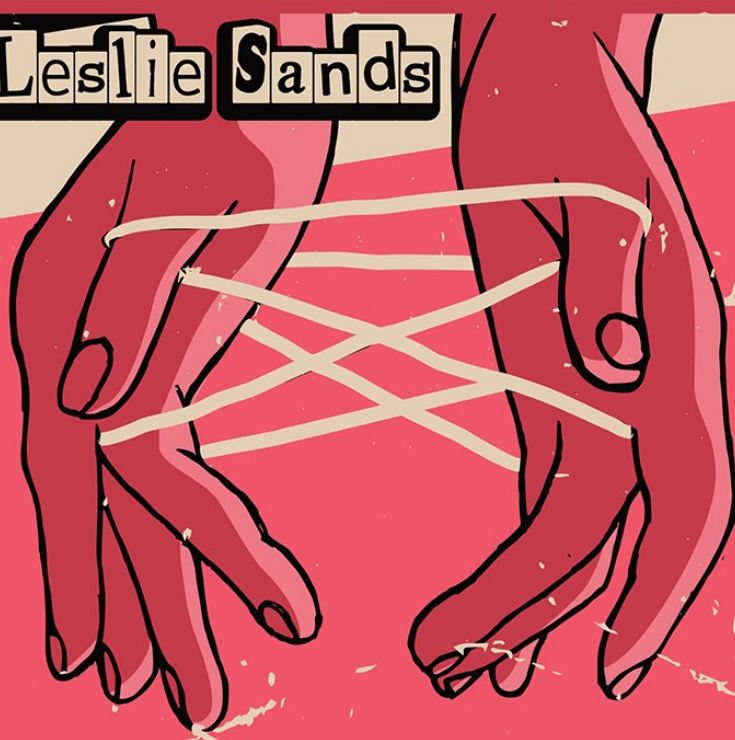

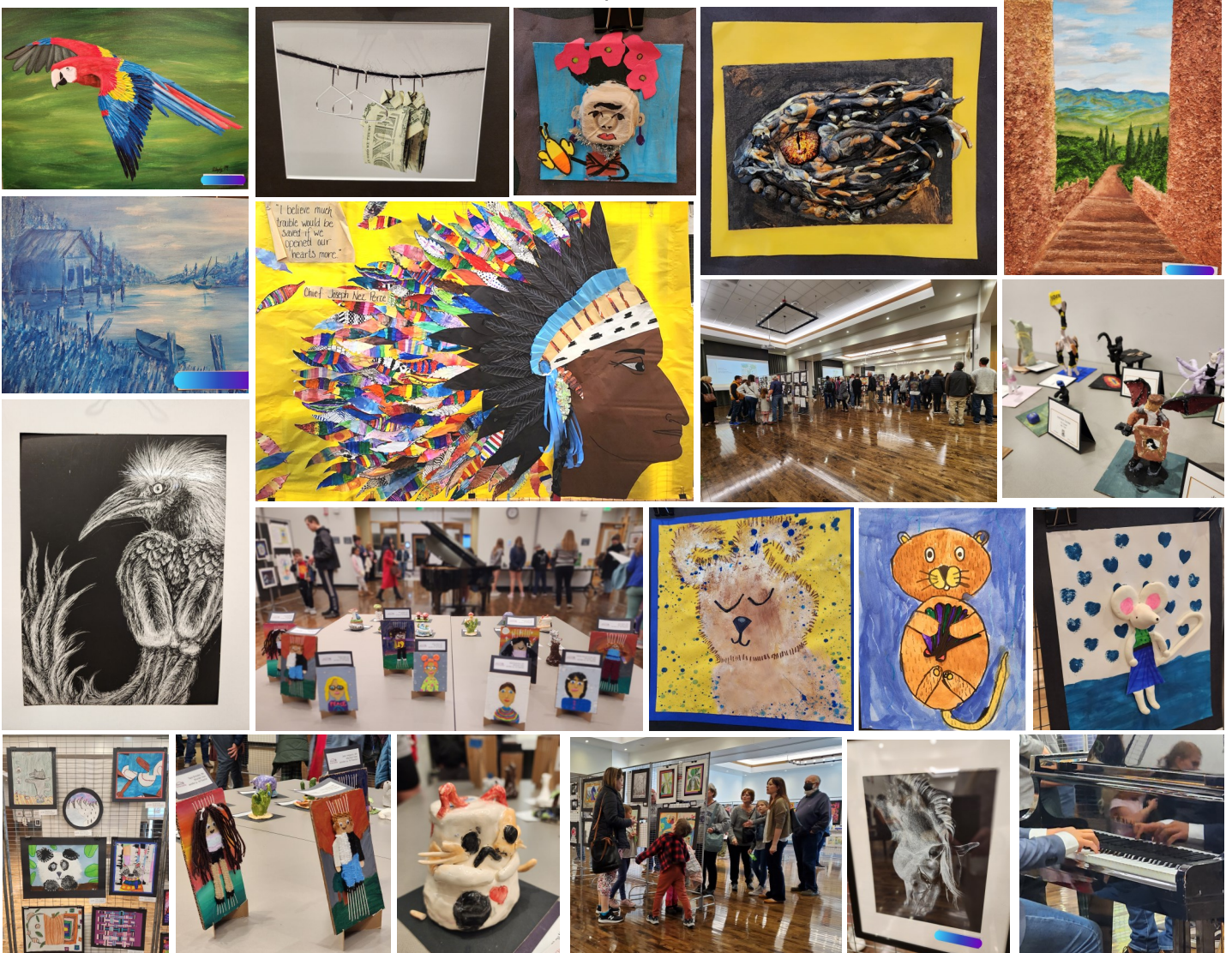

Memorial Day Ceremony

In May, the Broomfield Veterans Museum is hosting the City and County of Broomfield's annual Memorial Day Ceremony and picnic which will feature the North Metro and Broomfield Police Department Honor Guard, the honoring of Gold Star families, remarks from Mayor Guyleen Castriotta, and a speech from Colonel Michael J. Bruno. There will also be patriotic music from the Broomfield Civic Chorus and Rocky Mountain Brassworks, plus activities and displays from local reenactor groups, a flyover, and hamburgers for sale from the Broomfield Lions Club. This event is an opportunity for the community to come together to remember those who served and died for our country.

Coffee & Conversations

2nd & 4th Saturdays | 10 a.m.

Broomfield Veterans Museum: 12 Garden Center

The Broomfield Veterans Museum invites you to enjoy coffee, donuts, networking, and a great presentation by a veteran or historian.

In an informal setting, these C&C events provide museum visitors with an opportunity to listen to the stories of service and sacrifice, ask questions of our speakers and other veterans, see short videos and discuss the broader context of their experiences.



April 8 – Drew Payne and several members of the local Mile-High Wing (MHW) of the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) will join us to talk about their volunteer organization and its ongoing restoration of a rare WWII era, dual engine Beechcraft 18 airplane (Sonora Beauty) in its original military configuration. The aircraft served on active duty with the US Navy from July 1943 to 1965. The Mile-High Wing is a Denver-based unit of the CAF which is a worldwide, all-volunteer nonprofit organization dedicated to the restoration and preservation of the great warplanes that dominated the skies during World War II. The MHW is based at Rocky Mountain Metropolitan Airport in Broomfield, Colorado.

April 22 – Bill Frueh will tell the inspirational story of "Sergeant Reckless" (c. 1948 – 1968), a decorated warhorse who held official rank in the United States Military. Reckless was bought by members of the US Marine Corps and trained to be a pack horse for the Recoilless Rifle Platoon, Anti-Tank Company, 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division in Korea. She served in numerous combat actions during the Korean War, carrying supplies and ammunition, and was also used to evacuate wounded. She also became the first horse in the Marine Corps known to have participated in an amphibious landing. Following the war, she was awarded two Purple Hearts, a Marine Corps Good Conduct Medal, and inclusion in her unit's two Presidential citations. Bill Frueh is a prior C&C presenter, a military and Civil War historian and reenactor, and the head of the local chapter of the American Military Living History Association.

May 13 – Lew Moir served 28 years in the US Air Force including Strategic Air Command Operations during the Cold War years. Lew flew a wide range of fighters and strategic bombers, including the F-86 Saber jet and SAC bombers such as the B-47 and B-52. During the Vietnam War, he flew 75 B-52 combat missions with over 280 combat hours. Lew will share a variety of personal "Cold War Stories."

May 27 – Gail Elias will give a special talk about the history and ongoing efforts to preserve the Boulder County WWI Memorial Pillars located at the intersection of Rt. 287 and Arapahoe Road in Lafayette. The two pillars, which were erected in 1921 to honor Boulder County soldiers who served in WWI, are now threatened with collapse. The formal title for the memorial is the "Road of Remembrance Gateway Pillars." Gail also has self-published a book telling the story of 50 Boulder soldiers who died of the flu during the war. She is Regent of the Indian Peaks Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and a member of the Mitigation Working Group developing a plan to save the memorial. This talk is the capstone of our special museum exhibit, "Colorado In World War I."



Sharing the Art of Storytelling with Many

The Broomfield Spellbinders is a team of volunteer storytellers who share the art of storytelling. These storytellers share stories with youngsters in 21 local schools, as well as residents of several senior centers. We closed last year by participating in Anthem Ranch’s “Holly Jolly Grandkids Celebration” (see photo at right; Vanita Moore) and look forward to similar events there in the future.



This summertime, some of our storytellers will participate in and many others will attend a biweekly series of music and storytelling collaborations, Tunes & Tales, in the Lafayette Outdoor Amphitheater. This series is scheduled in response to a highly successful event last Summer that included stories from three of our members. The Spellbinders are also currently raising funds for our program by accepting donations for copies of a compilation of stories, *Pop Tales* by Wynn Montgomery, one of our members.

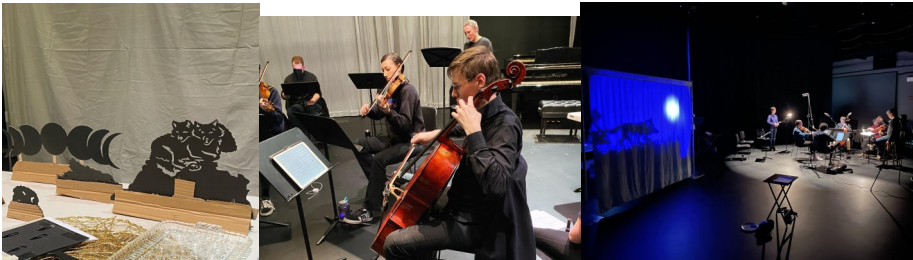

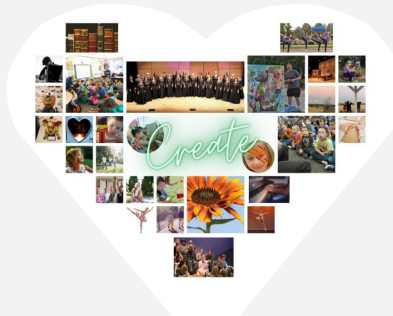
