

Congregations, pastors, your relatives, but so many more people we don't know.

People from Ohio, Minnesota, Nebraska, Iowa; from Iowa, Hawarden and throughout the state. Lutherans, Methodists, Reformed, and unknown have called, sent gifts, and showed up to help. Help has come. ESV Luke 17:13 and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us."

We have prayed this prayer, too, throughout our lives. We pray it nearly every week in the liturgy. "Lord, have mercy, Christ, have mercy, Lord, have mercy!" Jesus, Master have mercy on us is a prayer for Jesus to have compassion, to come to our aid, to do what no one else could do. Jesus, Master have mercy on us is a cry for help.

There have been many cries for help these last months. June 22 people cried for help to sandbag, to stop the water coming. Help was called to rescue people when the water got to high. Help was needed when people watched helplessly when water entered their homes not knowing how bad it would be, but fearing the worst. Help was called for to God when I saw water filling the parking lot of our church and our home. Help was called because there was nothing we could do. Jesus, savior have mercy upon us.

Helplessness marked the life of the leper. No treatments, no relief of pain, no cure was possible. Once you were infected, you were exiled from the community, your family, and even the worship of God. There was no one to have mercy on them. They were completely helpless. But Jesus came. Jesus came in their complete helplessness to have mercy. He sends them to the priest because that was what the Law of God demanded. But one leper... one realized, he was healed. He couldn't help himself; He came back to Jesus praising God, He fell at Jesus' feet and worshipped Him.

In our helplessness Jesus has come to have mercy on us. He has mercy by taking our sins as His own. He has mercy by dying in our place. He has mercy by rising from the dead and destroying the wrath of God and punishment of death. He has mercy by giving us this life, this forgiveness, this mercy in His Word and in His body and blood. How can we not be thankful. How can we not come back to Jesus. Jesus has done it all. He's done. It. All. Without Him there is no help, no mercy.

But with Him we have everything. We have cried for help, for mercy! And help and mercy have come from Him! Having received help and mercy, our life with Him is lived in gratitude.
