Erma Louise Bombeck (1927-1996) was an American humorist who achieved great popularity for her newspaper column that described suburban home life from the mid-1960s until the late 1990s. Bombeck also published 15 books and wrote over 4,000 newspaper columns.

Benjamin O. Davis Jr. (1912-2002) was an American U.S. Air Force general and commander of the World War II Tuskegee Airmen. He was the first African-American general officer in the U.S. Air Force.

Julia Carolyn Child (1912-2004) was an American chef, author and television personality. She is recognized for bringing French cuisine to the American public with her debut cookbook, *Mastering the Art of French Cooking*, and her subsequent television programs, the most notable of which was *The French Chef*, which premiered in 1963.

César Estrada Chávez (1927-1993) was an American labor leader and civil rights activist who, with Dolores Huerta, co-founded the National Farm Workers Association (later the United Farm Workers union, UFW) in 1962.

Robert F. Kennedy portrayed by Jeremy Meier

Robert Francis "Bobby" Kennedy (1925-1968) was an American politician and lawyer who served as the 64th U.S. Attorney General from Jan 1961 to Sept 1964, and as a U.S. Senator from New York from Jan 1965 until his assassination in June 1968. Kennedy, like his brothers John and Edward, was a prominent member of the Democratic Party and has come to be viewed by some historians as an icon of modern American liberalism.
