

The roof line is set off by cornice returns and milled frieze boards. Brick chimneys are set in the center of the rear gable end and off-set from the gable peak near the center of the house. Windows are double-hung, 1/1, throughout. A one story wing has a later shed roof addition; the gabled entrance porch is also an add-				
16. History and Significance The house was built in 1897 by Christopher Michaels (aka Michal, aka Michaelis) on a parcel of land purchased from Ann Twidney (ERI-1595). Michaels was among the second wave of German immigrants who were attracted to this region by its viticulture. in the mid 1880's. Born in Germany in 1862, Christopher came to the U.S. in 1883, marrying his German born wife, Paul-

He also took in one or more boarders to augment his income.
