Recovery Belief System

There are core beliefs that foster recovery from codependency and addiction. The key beliefs include:

- Addiction is a disease. This is the fundamental belief that allows responding versus reacting. It also is the basis for each of the remaining beliefs. The addiction process started with a choice the choice to use. Roughly 10% of the using population will become addicted and will lose the power of choice. For these people, using is no longer fun but is needed just to feel normal. At this point, it is a disease just like diabetes and cancer.
- The three C's. You did not Cause the disease, you can't Control the disease, and you can't Cure the disease.
- Recovery cannot be done alone; however, each person is responsible for their own recovery. You cannot work someone else's program for them.
- Do not enable. Enabling is both doing something for someone that they can and should do for themselves and doing things that enable continued use of mind-altering chemicals.
- Letting go and detaching are actions that foster recovery in you and your loved-one.
- God's plan and not my plan. My higher power has a plan for my loved-one and me. My task is to seek God's plan for me and let my loved-one do the same.
- We are responsible for our own actions and we accept, without blaming others, the consequences of our own actions.
- Our loved-ones are responsible for their own actions and we will accept, without blaming others, the natural consequences of their actions.
- This is a program of unconditional love; not unconditional trust. Love is given. Trust is earned.
- You can love someone and not like them. You can love someone and not want to be with them.
- We live in the present; not regretting the past; not worrying about the future.
