More than a hundred interviews have been recorded, transcribed, digitized and shared with families, residents, and visitors. The multimedia exhibit includes new oral histories,

The exhibit also traces how these oral histories have been collected over time and the variety of equipment used over the decades. *Presenting Orcas Voices* strives to inspire further exploration of the museum's collection and the stories that make up Orcas history.


May 21st, 12:00pm - 4:00pm Cruise into History: Sentinels of Orcas Island and Surrounding Waters


