# No Bones About It ~ Get Screened

## Make your bones as strong as your spirit!

One in five women over the age of 50 is affected by osteoporosis, a medical condition that causes bones to become weak and more likely to break.

Most women do not even realize they have osteoporosis until a bone breaks, or they experience spine problems. The good news is that osteoporosis can be prevented through screening and lifestyle changes.

Whether you've just been diagnosed with osteoporosis, living with it for some time, or have never been screened for it, chances are you have many questions: "How do I manage this disease?", "Will I break a bone or suffer a second fracture?", "Do I have to give up the activities I love?"



Your VA primary care provider can partner with you to assess your risk factors for osteoporosis and create a plan to help you strengthen your bones and, if needed, arrange a DEXA (Dualenergy X-ray absorptiometry) scan. The DEXA scan is a special type of Xray that tests your bone density. It is quick, simple and requires no preparation!

All women should be aware of

factors that increase their risk of osteoporosis: Having a family history of osteoporosis, menopause, having a small, thin body (weighing less than 127 pounds), not receiving enough calcium or vitamin D, having a sedentary lifestyle,

having an eating disorder, smoking, taking certain medications and drinking excessive alcohol can all increase a woman's risk.

The best way to reduce your risk of osteoporosis is through lifestyle changes. Focus on the following protective factors to begin strengthening your bones. If you can't focus on all of them, then choose a few to focus on and start helping your bones now! Protective factors include: not smoking, regular weight-bearing exercises like walking, jogging, or dancing; getting enough calcium and vitamin D through a nutritious diet, and spending regular time outside in the sun.

# "FIGHTING FOR COUNTRY: TODAY'S MILITARY WOMAN"

# APPLICANTS WHO DO NOT ADHERE TO ALL INSTRUCTIONS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

## **Applicant Eligibility**

- 1. Must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 2. Must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 3. Entries must be submitted by 30 June 2026: NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 4. Military personnel and veterans **MAY NOT APPLY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP**.

## Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

- 1. Completed Application.
- 2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.

NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security numbers on high school or college transcripts.

- 3. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the above topic. The essay must be the applicant's own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence (including a bibliography) of both research and <u>an interview with at least one military woman</u>. Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.
- 4. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include **separate attachments** for the following:
  - (1) Completed Application
  - (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
  - (3) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.
