What is the Jubilee Year?

And How do I get my Diocese of Harrisburg Jubilee Year passport?!

Read below to learn about this special year throughout the Catholic Church as well as how to go on pilgrimages (trips to holy places) and participate in our local Diocese of Harrisburg

What is a Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is traditionally proclaimed by the Universal Church every 25 years. It is a particular year set aside to encourage the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, to repent of their sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew a focus on the spiritual life. In the Hebrew tradition, as recorded in Leviticus, a Jubilee was celebrated every 50 years with the freeing of slaves and the forgiveness of debts. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee, and since then the Church has designated each new Jubilee as a special year of grace and forgiveness, offering the faithful an opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence.

The Jubilee Year in the Catholic Church around the world!

The Vatican website of the Catholic Church include a variety of resources to better understand the purpose of richness of entering into the specific practices and dispositions of heart that are encouraged during a Jubilee Year. For example, Pope Francis has dedicated this year to the supernatural virtue of Hope, and he has written and talked on this in some official documents, letters, homilies, and speeches. There are also detailed explanations of the following spiritual topics on the Vatican Jubilee Year website: *Pilgrimage, Holy Door, Reconciliation, Prayer, Liturgy, Profession of Faith, and Indulgences* among many other great resources! Coming to a Catholic Church near You – Get your <u>passport</u> and visit some of our beautiful Catholic Churches throughout the Diocese of Harrisburg!

Pick it up there, and then try to visit all seven Holy Doors in our Diocese if you can!

- Basilica of Saints Cyril and Methodius, Danville;

- Corpus Christi, Chambersburg;
- Our Lady of Hope, Coal Township.





The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children.

In today's Gospel, we hear about Jesus inviting Simon and some others to follow him.



What are the men doing when Jesus approaches them?

The men had been out fishing all night long in the Sea of Galilee. The Jordan River runs through it. Plenty of fish lived in the sea, so the people in the surrounding villages could work as fishermen. They did not use fishing rods. Instead, they had round nets that they cast into the water. After

each cast, the fishermen hauled the catch of fish into their boats.

The crowd who came to listen to Jesus is pressing closer to him, so he steps into Simon's boat. He asks Simon to push out into the water just a bit to make room between himself and the crowd. When Jesus finishes teaching the crowds, he told Simon to go out into the deep water and cast his nets. This time, Simon resists, telling Jesus they were fishing all night and caught nothing. But Simon agrees to do as Jesus commands. At once, they caught so many fish that the nets were tearing, and Simon called another boat to come help.

Simon falls to his knees and calls Jesus, "Lord." Simon and the other men leave everything on shore and follow Jesus. Jesus' first disciples were fishermen. He did not call just political leaders, or people who were famous. He called ordinary people and gave the gifts they needed to live as disciples.

When we were baptized, we too became disciples of Jesus. Jesus calls each of us as he called the disciples. This is our baptismal call. We are called to continue the work of Jesus in the world today. Through the Holy Spirit, God gives us the gifts we need to live as disciples of Jesus.
