





The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children

Have you ever felt like you wanted something another person had? Have you ever felt jealous over what someone else had?

When we want more than what we have, or more than what we need, that is called greed. Today's Gospel begins with Jesus warning us about greed. Jesus says, "Guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

The parable is about a rich man whose land produced so much more at harvest time that it would not fit into his barns. He tears down his barns to build bigger ones. He will store his overabundance and rest easy knowing he has enough stored up for years to come.

God calls the mas a fool. He asks the man what good full barns will be if he should die tonight. God says, "Thus it will be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

How can you grow rich in God's sight?

You can be nice to your brothers and sisters. Do what your parents ask you to do the first time they ask. Be nice to the children in your neighborhood. The more we use the gifts from our heart to help others, the more our gifts will grow. Since we are all connected to one another, the love and care we show others can change the world.




Knights of Columbus & The Ladies Auxiliary
