Special Meeting ----- May 2, 1988

The meeting was called to order by the Vice-Chair- ATTENDANCE man, George White at 7:00 P.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were Neal Dalton and Dan Holyoak, Darwin Gilger.

Others present were Rick Burtenshaw, representative of Zion's Bank, Dale Pierson, Marsha Modine and Roberta Highland.

Roberta Highland read the minutes of April 13, MINUTES After calling for additions or corrections, hearing none, the Chair declared the minutes approved as read.

> PROPOSAL FROM ZION'S BANK TO BUY BACK FmHA BONDS

Rick Burtenshaw handed those present an updated proposal from Zion's Bank and gave a brief history of the FmHA sell-out; he stated that the bonds were being put into a pool of 10 million dollars, and Zion's Bank has been contacting bond holders. Darwin asked if the District could pay the approximately \$6,000. per year in additional bond payments to get on this program. Marsha stated the District would have to raise approximatly \$4,000.00 more per year in revenues. Marsha reported that she had run some projections, and from those projections, a 10 cents per thousand above the minimums would raise the necessary funds; The proposal would eventually save \$852,000.00. Burtenshaw stated that the District will not be able to re-finance these bonds with tax exempt funds. Burtenshaw explained that for the first five years, there can be no pre-payment, after five years, a pre-payment penalty, and after ten years, no pre-payment penalty. Dan moved to accept the proposal and re-finance the bonds with Zion's Bank. Neal stated he felt obliged to keep rates the same, as the Board had promised never to raise rates. George seconded the motion to re-finance the Pierson pointed out that consideration should be given the District members, who do not use water and sewer will benefit from this in the tax reduction. Darwin asked Marsha to publish an article in the paper, and present some questions for Dee Tranter and appear on his program. enshaw reminded the Board of the timing involved, by the lØth of May we will know exactly what the buy out will be, with a June 7th closing. The Board will need to have a meeting in Mid-May. Rick explained that the good faith deposit will obligate the District, and that if the financing from Zions does not go through, then FmHA would then either use that deposit as a pre-payment on the end of the bonds, or use it as the next payment. Darwin asked if the interest is set at 10.7% or better. Rick replied the indications are that this rate will stand, and he is comfortable with the numbers, but the discount rates are not under control, and these discount rates will govern the final rates. The motion was called, to buy the bonds, to be guaranteed by Zion's Bank, provided the figures prove out, votes were as follows: Dan Yes, George Yes, Neal No. MOTION CARRIED by

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majority. Neal stated that for the record, he was not BUY-BACK OF opposed to the concept of paying off the bond early, he was FmHA BONDS (cor not comfortable with the time frame, and would have liked more time to think over the buy-out, and receive some public imput.

Dan moved a public hearing to make the raise of ten RATE INCREASE cents per thousand above the minimum and the resolution authorizing the buyout be noticed for May 18, 1988 at the District office. George seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Pierson reported that Jim McGann lives on Maynard Road, JIM McGANN about 900' from the present line. He will need a 2" line to CONNECTION allow for friction loss. To serve more than one customer in that area would require a 4" line. It would cost Jim 2,000.00 to hook up to the water, \$1.000. to install the line and \$1.000.00 for line installation. If we put in a 4" line, then anyone else would have to pay him \$500.00 to hook onto that line. The Board agreed by consensus to put in the 4" line.
