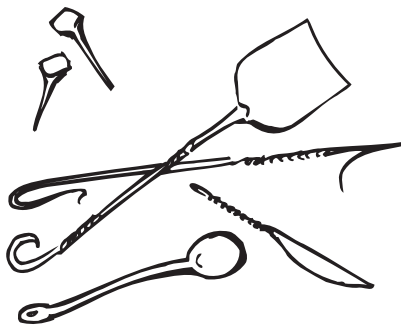


COLONIAL TRADE CARDS

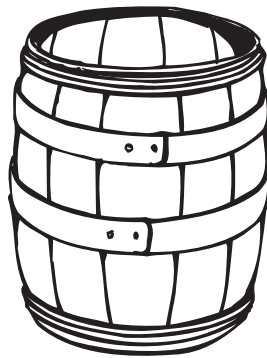
Blacksmith

He made the large wooden barrels for storage.



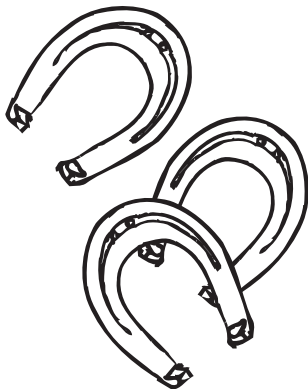
Cordwainer

He cut and sewed shoes by hand.



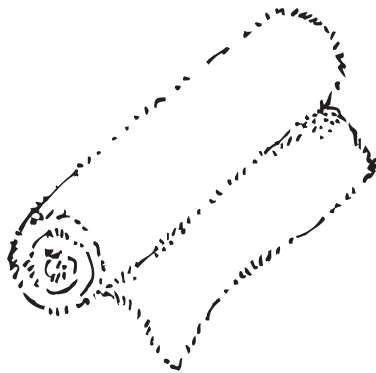
Farrier

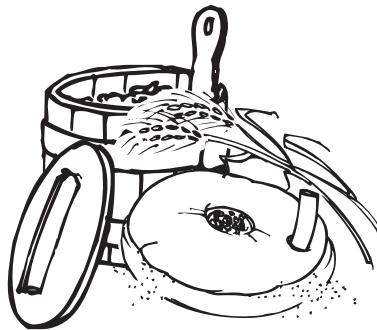
Joiner
