

Styles of Corrugated Board Boxes



RSC – Regular Slotted Container

This is the most commonly produced container style. All flaps have the same length, with the outer (usually the length flaps) meeting at the center of the box when folded.



FOL – Full Overlap Container

This style has flaps that are equal to the width of the box and fully overlap the top and bottom. This style is especially resistant to rough handling and is an excellent option for an end-loaded carton.



HSC – Half Slotted Container

Same as Regular Slotted Container without one set of flaps.



OPF – One Piece Folder

This is a single piece of board that creates a wrap for the product. The sides and ends are formed with flaps with the side flaps meeting in the middle.



FPF – Five Panel Folder

A single piece that features a fifth panel that is used as a closing flap. The packaged box features several layers of corrugated on each end providing additional protection.



D/S Tray – Design Style Trays

Two telescoping pieces that fit over each other to form a box.



Die Cut Mailer

This style utilizes self-locking roll ends. They may feature perforated rolls, vent holes, or similar custom options.



Die Cut Tray

This style utilizes self-locking roll ends. They may feature perforated rolls, vent holes, or similar custom options.



Partition

Used as inner packaging pieces to separate spaces within a container.
