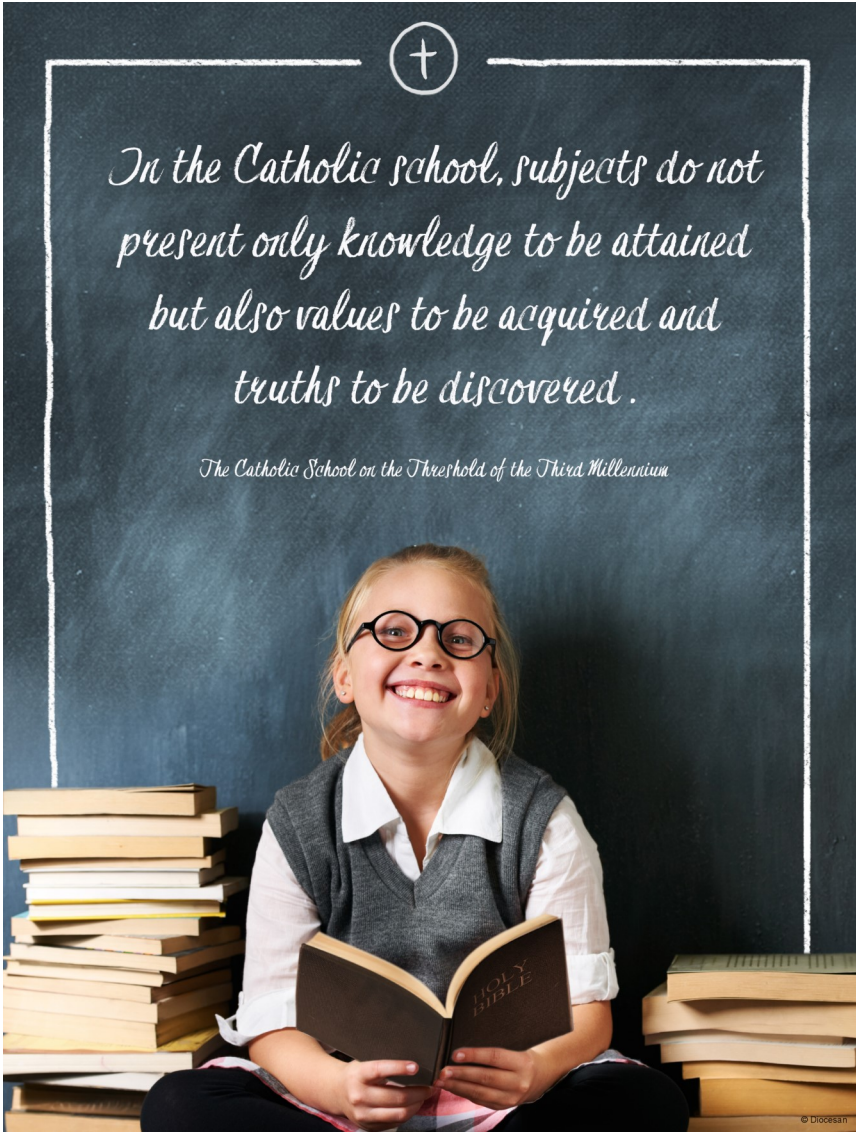

Blessing of Throats



We will have blessing of throats in honor of Saint Blaise after all Masses next weekend. Saint Blaise was a doctor as well as a bishop in Armenia during the fourth century. It is believed that Blaise once healed a boy who was choking on a fish bone. Because of that, he is the patron of the sick, especially people with illnesses of the throat. It is an ancient custom to pray for good health with a blessing of throats on his feast day.

Blessing of Candles/Candlemas

On Monday, February 2, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast occurs 40 days after Christmas. Simeon recognized Christ as the Messiah and referred to Him as the "Light of revelation to the nations." On the Feast of the Presentation, candles are traditionally blessed for use in the Church and in the home. The blessed candles will be available for purchase for those who are interested. The donation for a box of two 8 inch candles is \$4; Votive candles (all colors) are \$3. Parishioners are also invited to bring candles from home to be blessed.

Stewardship Reflections

Today's readings remind us that stewardship is not just a thing we do - rather, stewardship is at the core of who we are as disciples of Christ. Our first reading, from Isaiah, contains this prophecy of Christ and what His saving message would mean to all who embrace it. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwell in the land of gloom a light has shone." We are among those blessed people on whom the light of Christ has shone. By virtue of our Baptism we who were once in the darkness and gloom of original sin have been born again into the great light that is God's grace in us.

We have become cherished members of God's family. What a privilege! Yet, with this privilege comes the responsibility to actually live for God and to bring His good News to all those we meet at work, at school, in our community and right in our own home. This is the essence of a stewardship way of life - to be always ready for the ways that our Lord is calling us to bring His light to others. It's more than something we do - it's who we are.

Saint Benedict School Registration



Saint Benedict School will accept registrations for the 2026-2027 academic year the week of February 2nd. Children may be enrolled for the Pre-kindergarten 3 and Pre-kindergarten 4 programs, which include religious education and a curriculum that readies pupils for success in Kindergarten. The PK3 program offers classes on Tuesday and Thursday, while the PK4 program offers 3 different options for scheduling. Children may also be enrolled for all-day kindergarten and grades 1 through 8.

Children must be three or four years old, respectively, for pre-kindergarten, five years old for kindergarten, and six years old for first grade by August 31, 2026. Children being enrolled in kindergarten should accompany their parent to Saint Benedict School on the day of registration. A birth certificate, social security card, immunization record, Baptismal certificate, and a \$40 non-refundable fee must be provided at the time of registration. Please contact the School Office at 814-344-6512 to obtain enrollment forms and to schedule an appointment to register your child.
