

# First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The LORD visits Abraham and Sarah to tell them that the long-awaited promise of the birth of a child will be fulfilled for them in their old age.

<sup>1</sup>The LORD appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. <sup>2</sup>He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. <sup>3</sup>He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. <sup>4</sup>Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. <sup>5</sup>Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." # Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-28


This letter offers a mystical teaching, that the great mystery of God is "Christ in you." Because Christ is present in the church, Christians share in his life, suffering, and glory.

<sup>15</sup>[Christ Jesus] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation;<sup>16</sup>for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup>He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. <sup>18</sup>He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. <sup>19</sup>For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, <sup>20</sup>and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

<sup>21</sup>And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup>he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him—<sup>23</sup>provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

<sup>24</sup>I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. <sup>25</sup>I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, <sup>26</sup>the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. <sup>27</sup>To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. <sup>28</sup>It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

# Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

During his visit to the home of Mary and Martha, Jesus reminds Martha that her concern for her many tasks distracts from the one thing that precedes all else: abiding in the presence of God. <sup>38</sup>Now as [Jesus and his disciples] went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. <sup>39</sup>She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. <sup>40</sup>But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." <sup>41</sup>But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; <sup>42</sup>there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

In Christ you brought forth the firstborn from the dead. We give thanks for the saints you have gathered at your table. Gather us with them in your eternal glory. God of grace,



#### From the Refugee Support Group

by Morris Casper and Phil and Sally Hart Following my temple talk earlier this year in which I asked interested members of the congregation to help me form a support group, five people stepped forward. The group that formed is made up of Bill Gresham, Phil and Sally Hart, Carolyn Ulrich, Jayce Getz, and myself, Morris Casper.

On April 29<sup>th</sup>, we met the family of Gul Wali Safi and Shakila Safi. they were originally residents of Jalalabad on the main road from Kabul to Peshawar, Pakistan. Gul Wali was a driver for the American Forces in the region. They have eight children; the 2 oldest are boys: Sher Wali, 16; and Wahidullah, 13. The younger six are all girls: Shaista, 12; Bibi Aisha, 10; Bibi Miriam, 7; Safa, 6; Madina, 3; and Yosra, 1.

They are living in Colonial Apartments on Chapel Hill Street in Durham. The group's tasks include providing some transportation, especially to medical appointments, language training, being a liaison to

Lutheran Services of the Carolinas, providing miscellaneous information, and other tasks as required.

So far, the family seems to be doing well and adapting to life in Durham. Dad is working a night shift job in Cary while mom is at home with the children.

The Afghan Support Group could also use assistance driving the Safi family members to medical appointments. We are especially in need of female volunteer drivers. Because of Afghan customs and Lutheran Services Carolinas rules, only a female driver can drive the mother, Shakila, and no one can drive the children unless the mother or father accompany the children. With 8 children in the family this means that Shakila goes on most medical appointments which requires a female driver. Thank you for considering this volunteer opportunity.

As we learn more about the Safi family, we will let you know.






