



What Happens on "PLC" Early Release Days?

We are currently in the 3rd year of our Early Release Friday calendar at DVUSD.

The early release schedule allows for job embedded time for our teachers to:

- Collaborate,
- Analyze data
- Identify standards,
- Identify skills
- Identify students who are in need of reteaching, enrichment, or adjustment in pacing of instruction.

At Highland Lakes, our Kindergarten through 6th grade teams meet with their grade level as well as other teachers from Greenbrier and Park Meadows. Additionally, our 7th and 8th grade teachers meet both as content level teams and collaboratively with other middle school teachers from Sierra Verde, West Wing, and Stetson Hills to complete work for early release PLC Fridays.

Finally, Highland Lakes' Renaissance teachers meet with content area and or grade level teams on campus as well as with Renaissance teachers from Canyon Springs.

This time is crucial for our teachers to be able to plan, adjust, and prepare to meet the needs of our students. DVUSD was recently named one of only a very select few Model PLC Districts in the nation. We are very proud of our accomplishments and are grateful for this time to focus on student learning and growth.

Teacher Leader Engineering Network

The Teacher Leader Engineer Network (TaLENT Project) is a collaborative teacher fellowship through Rice University, through a grant from NSF (National Science Foundation).

<u>The TaLENT Project</u> group consisted of 15 teachers from across the U.S. (5 Elementary, 5 Middle School and 5 High School). Our very own **Mr. Currier** was one of the elementary teachers. TaLENt meetings centered on improving engineering instruction in K-12 schools and resulted in the creation of a guidebook for teaching engineering at each level.


Mr. Currier brought this knowledge and experience back to Highland Lakes where six of our teachers are working on a book study project that will help incorporate engineering practices into science lessons.

The criteria in the book have parallels to our newly implemented Science Standards. Our 3rd,4th,5th,6th Renaissance and 4th & 5th departmentalized Science Teachers are all participating in a once a month focus and lesson group to get this knowledge into the classroom.

Lesson Meetings include:

- Focusing on criteria from TaLENt Guidebook
- Criteria include: Brainstorming; Communication; Risk-Taking Environment; Student-Centered Problem Solving; Teamwork
- Teachers meet at least once a month and focus lessons around one of the criteria.

MEALS ARE FREE TO ALL STUDENTS FOR 21-22 SY

Children need healthy meals to learn. Deer Valley Unified School District will be offering healthy meals to all students at no cost every school day in School Year 2021-2022. Your child(ren) can receive a free breakfast and lunch every school day regardless of your household's income. Funding for this benefit is provided by the U.S Department of Agriculture.

We are committed to offering nutritious and convenient meals. Our cafeterias offer a variety of entrée options daily, one of which is always vegetarian. School lunches offer five meal components daily (fruit, vegetable, grain, protein, and milk). Although students are encouraged to take all five, they need to choose at least three of the five components, one of which needs to be a fruit or vegetable.

. SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

We promote everyday protective measures. Every cafeteria manager is a certified Food Safety Manager and our department follows a HACCP-based food safety program.

Cleanliness is important to us. We continually wash and disinfect our hands and equipment.

Tables and surfaces are thoroughly cleaned and sanitized between use.

We provide touchless checkout and have eliminated all self-serve food and beverage bars and stations.

MEAL APPLICATIONS AND RELATED BENEFITS



Although meals are free this year, families are encouraged to submit a meal application because certification may be used for other programs, such as P-EBT, funding for your school, reduced registration fees for academic tests, discounted rates for internet service, and more!



Free and reduced-price meal applications are distributed to students during the first week of school and can also be found online at www.EZMealApp.com or www.dvusd.org/mealassistance.



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Students who were eligible for benefits last year are eligible for the same benefits the first 30 days of the new school year.

All students must submit a new application no later than September 14, 2021 to continue meal certification and related benefits, if eligible.

SNACKS & INDIVIDUAL PORTIONS

Although each student may receive one FREE breakfast and lunch per day, there are charges for individual portions (including milk), as well as snack items.



All snack and beverage items sold in the cafeteria are required to meet national Smart Snack Standards.



A la carte items vary by school. Please contact your cafeteria manager with questions.



Parents may contact their student's cafeteria manager any time to place restrictions on a student's ability to purchase snacks.

Restrictions can be made in several different ways including: setting daily spending limits, allowing snacks on certain days only, or blocking all snack sales.

A la carte purchases are not permitted when a student's meal account has a negative balance.

MEAL ACCOUNT TRANSACTIONS AND PAYMENT OPTIONS

When a student is enrolled in school they are given an ID number from the school's front office that they will keep throughout their time at DVUSD. This is also their meal account number. In the secondary schools, this number or the bar code on their student ID, will be used for a la carte transactions or to make a deposit on their meal accounts. In elementary schools, cafeteria personnel will use the number to access student accounts for transactions.

> Parents can add money to a student's account in three different ways:

Cash: With cash in the cafeteria.

Check: Students may bring a check to the cafeteria. Checks should include their student ID and phone number.

Online: Payments can be made at <u>www.EZSchoolPay.com</u> using Visa, Master-Card, or Discover card for a small transaction fee. Parents can also use EZSchoolPay to view student spending and set up low balance reminders **at no cost**.

MEAL ACCOUNT BALANCES, PAYMENTS AND REFUNDS

- Both positive and negative account balances carry with your student from year to year and school to school.
- With meals FREE to all students, now is a great time to pay down your student's meal account.
- À la carte purchases are not permitted when the account has a negative balance.
- Graduating or withdrawing student account balances can be transferred to younger siblings, donated to assist students in need, or refunded.
- Refund requests for graduating seniors and those not returning to DVUSD, must be submitted by June 30 of each school year. Requests should be submitted to DV.Lunch@dvusd.org. Student name & ID#, parent/guardian name and mailing address should be included in request.

CUTS Program: (<u>Court Unified Truancy Suppression</u>)

To encourage and improve school attendance, Deer Valley Unified School District has implemented a truancy program in partnership with Maricopa County Juvenile Court. Highland Lakes will be tracking attendance very closely. Your child is expected to be at school every day, unless there is an excused reason not to be. A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused. If a student should start a pattern of excessive absences, you will be contacted by letter or phone. The education of your child is extremely important to us. This program is another way of working with the community to ensure a quality education for all students.
