- A rebate for new lights was applied for through Avista for the fire station, the town shop and the farm museum. Council decided to go forward with the fire station for \$0.00 out of pocket and the town shop for \$2,763.80 out-of-pocket. The farm museum would cost the town \$5,800 and it was decided that the use is not enough to justify the cost.
- Mr. Whitman has some suggestions about the 2025 budget.
