Pastor's Corner

Greetings Puckety family! For my salutation this month, I wanted to share something straight from my twin brother, Rev. Chris Kilbert, recently used in their church newsletter (Riverlawn) in WV – it conveys some end-of-summer “back to church” emphasis customary as we gear up for Fall. My brother, Chris wrote this a few weeks ago –

“It feels like such a long time sine I’ve seen or talked with a good number of you! There are, *of course*, a good number of reasons: some may still not feel comfortable gathering in enclosed places with groups of people ... some may be out of town frequently during the summer, and I pray you saw God move in those places. But some have been hurt or disappointed or disillusioned in some way with the challenges around us. Some may have just gotten out of the habit of communing as the Church. Don’t get me wrong, I am aware of the fact that many are struggling right now, and those struggles stretch deep (in intensity) and wide (in scope). But I also know that the body of Christ suffers when we are disconnected – it suffers in ways and to a degree that I believe many are simply not aware. We may think our own part is relatively small and wouldn’t make that

much of a difference (if not fit into the puzzle, etc.), but collectively, when the pieces are missing, it creates a huge effect. Think of the cascading impact (the domino effect if you will): It’s a detriment to our worship in community, our awareness through fellowship, our shared growth through discipleship, our shared ministry in our neighborhoods, our witness through visible unity ... Can you think of others? This isn’t about judgment. This is about longing. A longing to rekindle and reinforce that which isn’t just helpful and good, but essential and precious!”

[He then says something I’ve felt a couple times recently]: “In many instances, there is *irony* in the fact that we hesitate to return to weekly involvement in our community of faith because of our present struggles, when in fact it is the community of faith that helps bear us up, support us, and love us with the love of Christ, becoming a powerful encouragement to our hearts and a balm to our souls.”

I concur with my brother’s call for us to “Return” – and of course, we hear that call many times in God’s Word, not just in places like the Old Testament prophets, but the apostles in the New Testament, and Christ himself to the churches (see Revelation 2:3-5 and 3:14-20). But I’d also like to add words of gratitude and anticipation – which are also mixed into Christ’s letters to the churches in Revelation by the way. I have seen the Spirit at work at Puckety recently, and like when you see a little green shoot poke its way out of the ground – even when you have no idea what kind of plant it is – you know more’s coming. The question is, how well we receive it and care for it? So be refreshed by those with whom you share the grace and joy and love of Christ. Be ready to “seek first his Kingdom” and equipped to accomplish his Kingdom work! We are blessed as we gather in the presence of the Lord – and we are better able to bless others because of it. 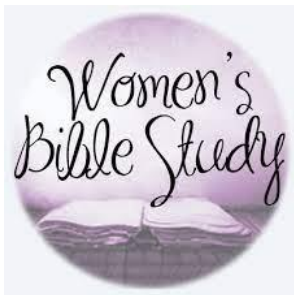

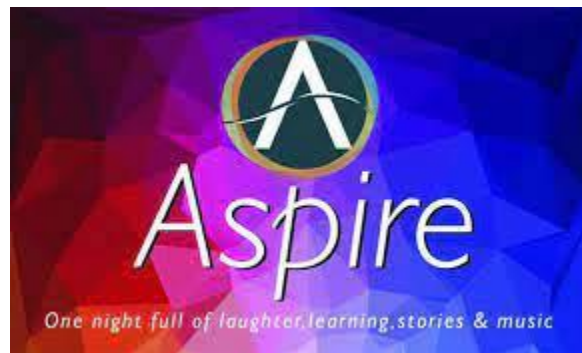

A Devotional For You – Read John 21:9, 15-19

I realized something this week: I have had the same personal email address for **over 20 years now** – sheepkeeper2116@yahoo.com. I chose it during my first year in seminary (2001). “Why’d you choose an address like that, Brian?” I’m so glad you asked. It’s based off of Jesus’ interchange with Peter at the end of the book of John (far and away my favorite Gospel). In John **21:16**, Jesus says, “Tend my sheep.” [Hence, “sheep-keeper” 2116]. Now, you’re probably already getting part of the picture – *shepherds* being a classic metaphor for the work of pastors in the Bible (not just in Johannine literature but also in Peter’s epistles) – conveying the ideas of caring for the welfare of God’s flock, feeding them with his Word, protecting them from dangers and threats, and leading them in the proper path, etc. And you’re right – since I knew I was going into ministry, I wanted something I’d use everyday that would remind me of my calling and responsibilities to the Lord. But there’s more to it than that too. What else is going on in this passage? Well, to get the full weight of it, you have to go all the way back to chapter 18, where Peter denies Jesus three times while warming himself by a fire (18:25ff.). Notice how (in ch. 21 after the resurrection) Jesus has made a fire on the shore. I don’t think he’s done that just to cook up some breakfast for his disciples to enhance the joy of the moment. Jesus is going to use that to further impress upon Peter the question he’s going to ask him – “Do you *love* me?” ... a question he would ask Peter 3 times! [Interestingly, something we only see in the Greek, the first two times, Jesus uses a different word for love than Peter does – Jesus says do you love (agape) me [*love me sacrificially*] and Peter replies (twice): “Yes, I love (phileo) you” [*with the closeness of a friend*] ...

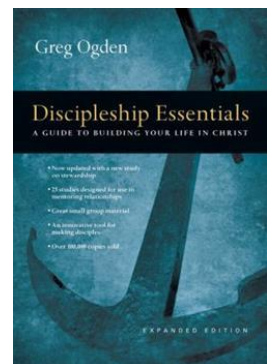
Some say Peter didn’t say “*agape*” because it seemed too cold, and in the intensity of the moment, he wanted a more affectionate term. But I believe Peter’s denials were too fresh for him to say “Yes, I’ll *sacrifice* myself for you,” because he *had* said he’d die for him (in the Upper Room), and then outside the court he wouldn’t even stand with him. So, Peter was probably afraid to come across hypocritical; he was probably careful to make the same level of claims that he did before, thinking of his faltering in front of the servant girl by the fire. So, in the light of another fire, in the presence of the One he denied, Peter has to face the music (or the ‘flames’ if you want to be literal).

This is the other half of the reason why every day I have my email address to remind me (often *more than 3x* since you often need your email to login to a host of sites). Sometimes that’s exasperating - but it’s good, because it’s a way I can hear Christ’s word come to me when I need to hear it ... “Now, face it Brian; you messed up ... there’s no more *denying* about it ... you have to face this; you have own this. But the way forward is in the same word I’m using to confront you with the truth – “love me” ... I love John 21 because it gives us this perennial pattern (makes me think of a perennial flower, there’s a time where it’s humble and “in the dirt” so to speak, but then the true light and living water brings it up, it rises to bloom and reach its potential). In this beautiful story, Jesus extends grace. He tells you and me, I’ve made a way so you can be restored, you can serve in purpose and joy once more ... it’s time to start again – you’ve learned a little more, and my grace will help you grow further as well.

Jesus told Peter to feed his sheep. But did you notice Jesus starts out by using Peter’s old name (Simon) ... perhaps because he had not lived up to the name Christ had given him (Petros means “rock”), BUT Jesus rehabilitated his disciple and now he could become what Jesus proclaimed in the namesake he gave him – Rock – as well as shepherd of the flock. Jesus sees into Simon Peter’s heart. He knows that now, Peter’s “boast” of love to Jesus is not empty, but sincere and cemented. It’s not “just words” anymore. And may they never be “just words” from us either – but the most living, breathing, verb that defines us. Amen.

“New Member” Small Group

Pastor Brian will be starting a weekly small group – **Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 PM** – starting on **September 7th**, and meeting *each week* for 10 weeks (finishing by 11/16). It is **open** *not* just to new members, but also open to anyone who would like to get a better understanding of some of the foundational aspects of Christian faith and practice. We will be using the revised edition of Greg Ogden’s classic, *Discipleship Essentials*. 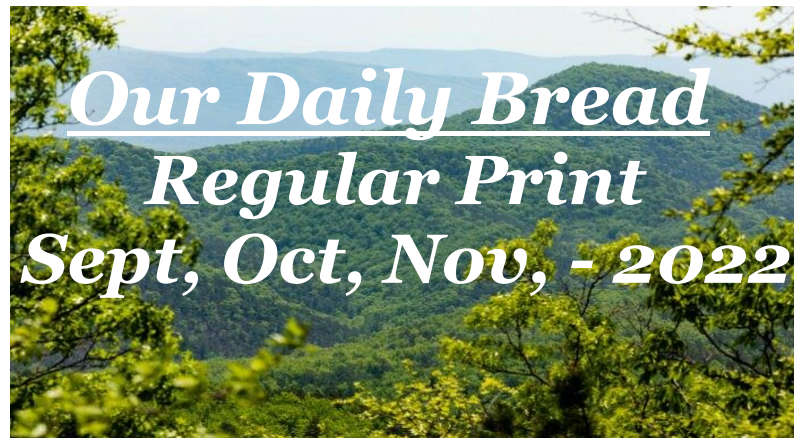

Burrell to lean on pair of senior linemen

Senior linemen Ian Quinn, left, and Aaron Mele will anchor both the offensive and defensive lines for Burrell.

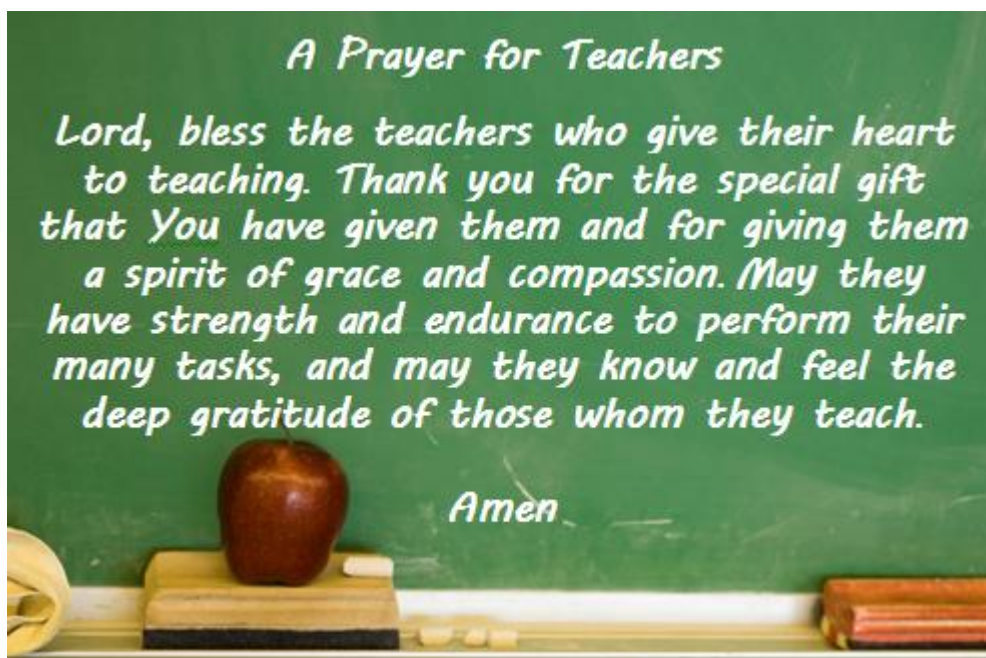


Aaron Mele knew from early on he was going to be moving defenders and protecting quarterbacks on the line. "My whole football career, I've played center, both guards and both tackles. I've played everywhere," Mele said. "My coaches have always made sure I've understood the importance of learning new techniques at every position" ... Mele will man the right tackle spot. He is 6-1 and is 280 pounds, also up about 15 pounds from last year. "This is our time," Mele said. "I want to be an example for the younger guys about what they can accomplish through playing football and putting in the hard work. Everyone is ready to show that the work we've done since last season ended is paying off" ... Mele earned an opportunity for starting time as a sophomore and was a full-time starter last year. "I am ready to take that next step in my game," Mele said. "There are a lot of great guys around me, and we're ready to help the offense make plays."

Quinn and Mele helped the line last year open holes in the running game to the tune of 1,936 yards, an average of 176 a game ... Quinn and Mele also hope to create havoc for opposing offenses beside each other in the defensive interior.

"Both Ian and Aaron have been in the program for four years and have meant so much to what we've been able to accomplish," Burrell coach Shawn Liotta said. "They are guys we definitely look to for leadership on and off the field. They are also great students in the classroom. They are the type of guys who know how to handle things when they are going good and also when there is adversity. They stay at an even keel, which is something their teammates certainly respect. They just go out and do their work and don't look for any credit. It's no secret that we're going to be counting a lot on Aaron and Ian and the other lineman this year."

"Go Aaron! Go Bucs!"
