




For every 1,000 labels we send in we get \$30. That may sound like a lot of labels but WELCA has been doing it for years! How many more could we save if the whole congregation would help!

### A Wealth of Generosity

We want you to know, brothers and sisters, about the grace of God that has been granted to the churches of Macedonia; for during a severe ordeal of affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. –2 Corinthians 8:1-2

Thank-you.

I want you to know, brothers and sisters, how grateful I am for your generosity. According to our 2016 Congregational Reports, 56% of our congregations in the Arkansas-Oklahoma Synod had an average worship attendance of under 50 people a Sunday. On the one hand, some would say that means our congregations are not "viable." And yet, I know from the time I have spent with you, that ministry in the name of Jesus Christ continues in powerful ways among you! On the other hand, at the recent Conference of Bishops' meeting, it was reported that the Arkansas-Oklahoma Synod was above the ELCA average in the percentage of our tithes and offerings we share beyond our local congregations. In spite of our many local struggles to make ends meet, we continue to be generous. Like the small, scrappy Macedonian church in Paul's time, our abundant joy and our (seeming) extreme poverty continue to overflow in a wealth of generosity on our part. For that, I am extremely grateful.

Not only are we a synod made up of small congregations, the Arkansas-Oklahoma Synod, is also one of the smallest synods in the ELCA. With around 7500 baptized members in 54 congregations and ministries we are the sixty-second largest synod in the ELCA (the Alaska Synod, the Caribbean Synod, and Slovak Zion Synod are smaller.) Like many small congregations, as a synod every day we strive to do the best ministry we can with the resources at hand. It's a challenge, but we have creative and resourceful leaders and synod staff. Your congregation's mission support is the bedrock of the work we do as synod, but we are always looking for ways to supplement and extend those dollars so that we can serve the broadest number of people possible in Jesus' name.

But what, exactly does a "synod" do? (Or more specifically, the synod staff.) I get asked that question a lot. The truth is much of what we do happens in the background of the mission and ministry that goes on in the foreground of congregational life. We're like faithful custodians... you don't notice their work until they stop doing it and the bathrooms get gross and the garbage cans begin to overflow. Your synod staff spends a lot of our time answering questions, connecting people and congregations to resources, helping congregations sort out problems and mediating conflicts. We provide guidance and direction to councils, deacons and pastors, worship leaders and office managers, members, visitors and newcomers. We gather and share information, ideas and news about what is happening around the synod and the ELCA in phone calls, text messages, the Weekly News, emails and social media. We work with congregations in transition, advising call processes, helping congregations find supply and interim ministers, sort through financial challenges and building issues, and do mission planning. We also (my favorite part) worship with congregations, lead workshops, teach classes and bible studies, participate in congregation programs and activities. Finally, we represent the synod on boards and councils of various types and connect the synod to the wider church, ecumenical partners and others in addressing social issues, crises, concerns and disasters. I'm sure I'm forgetting something!

All this costs money. You know that. But, did you know, for example, a visit to a congregation can cost the synod between \$300-\$700? That covers travel expenses (mileage, food, lodging), and salary to cover the preparation time, travel time and the time spent in the congregation. A call process can cost several thousand dollars, depending on how long the process lasts, the number of visits made and how much time it takes to identify and vet candidates. All that is covered by mission support and the generous gifts of individual donors!

It is amazing the amount of ministry our small synod supports and accomplishes by combining our gifts and working together as a synod! **That's why I am so g**rateful for your partnership, your prayers and your financial support. Together we steward one another so that when one congregation needs support, others step up, and when others need support that one, in turn, responds. By doing that, the mission of Jesus Christ continues across our three states!
