Memories of Christmas By Wade Anderson

Let me say this as we begin, "Just because someone is 'taught' something doesn't mean that they truly understand it. Understanding, for me, came many years later and only by God's Holy Spirit."

In all that I'm about to share here I want you to know that my brothers and I were 'taught' that the true reason for Christmas was not about what gifts we were going to get, but instead it was about the Greatest GIFT God had already given the whole world. It was out of His GREAT LOVE that God FIRST GAVE us Jesus. Listen here to what's recorded, in John 3:16, "For God so LOVED the world (you and I) that He GAVE His one and only Son ..." Many of us wonder if or how we could ever qualify to receive this Gift? Let me say this, "NONE of us could ever qualify in and of ourselves! Jesus became our Qualifier!" With one simple but yet life changing act from us listen as John explains in John 3:16, "That WHOSOEVER believes in Him (Jesus) shall NOT perish but have eternal life." So what are the qualifications? First you have to be a WHOSOEVER. Are you a WHOSOEVER? If you're struggling to answer that question the answer is YES! In the business of people running everywhere it blesses my heart to watch as, during this season, 'gift giving' is in just about every culture. The spirit of giving gifts just seems to fall on the world like a soft blanket. While even in the hardest of hearts people find themselves being a little more generous. So what is the true reason for this Season? He's one of God's greatest Gifts to mankind, the earthly birth and life of His Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

At a minimum of 700 years before Christ's birth, Isaiah prophesied Jesus' coming in the flesh in Isaiah 9:6, "For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." John shared the revelation he received from God's Holy Spirit of who Jesus was in John 1:1-5 and goes on in John 1:14 to say, "The WORD (Jesus) became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the One and only Son, who came from the Father, FULL OF GRACE AND TRUTH."

The memories that I share here are ones of gratefulness and happy times. My hope is that this will trigger and hopefully fill your hearts with a new excitement in your own memories. As we dust off the cobwebs of the memories way in the backs of our minds let's bring them out and look at them in a different light." I pray that deep in our hearts we ALL experience some of the greatest memories of people both in our lives today and from years gone by." The great thing about memories is we don't have to be in a specific place to remember, we can just simply flip the ole 'roll-a-dex' to 'great memories' and revisit. Remember, you do have the ability to separate and not revisit the unpleasant events in your own lives, unless you're directed to, because you do have the mind of Christ. (1 Corinthians 2:16)

I know firsthand that not ALL of our childhood memories were like Leave it to Beaver or Ozzy and Harriet. I know I just lost a whole bunch of the younger crowd with those two examples. But simply put, these were TV shows from the 1950's and 1960's. They stereotyped what a picture perfect American family should look like. In reality though, some of our memories may be more like an 'Ozzy Osborn' family, huh?! Just kidding. Just kidding. I couldn't resist the opportunity to say that and I KNOW that many of those we lost a minute ago we just picked back up because I'm pretty certain they have seen that TV show for sure. How did I get so far off the topic? I guess I forgot to stop that 'roll-a-dex' from spinning out of control.

People begin their next year's Christmas shopping list immediately after this year's stuff goes on sale. I know this because I too do the same thing. But not for gifts. I can barely wait for the day after Christmas because that's when I get busy hitting all of the Lowe's and Home Depot's to buy more 50% to 75% off Christmas decorations for the outside of our home. In fact every year, I end up with at least another full plastic tub of more lights and two or three more of those blow up yard decorations. Then the next year I have to figure out how I'm going to redesign it all to fit. I know, I know ... but it's because we didn't have those kinds of things when I was a kid is why I love to do it today.

When I was a young boy, I remember my mom driving us through what we thought were the 'rich' areas of town and being filled with excitement as we "Occed" and "Ahhed" at their outdoor decorations. Our family, like many others, were considered to be 'those kids from the other side of the tracks'. Today, as I decorate the outside of our home people drive up and even walk up while I'm in the process and say, "We're always excited to see what all you're going to put up each year." As parents drive by the kids hang out the window while I'm still on the roof and yell, "Thank you 'dinosaur house guy' for putting up the lights!" Even though we didn't have those things as we were kids I see it still brings joy and excitement to the kids around me today.

It seemed to us then that the people that decorated the outside of their homes were few. But on the inside most of the homes there were traditional Christmas decorations hanging everywhere. The smell of fresh baked breads, pies, cookies and food of all kinds lingered in the air from Thanksgiving until well after Christmas. I'm sure some of you more 'well mature' folks can remember those candy dishes of HARD ribbon candies and bowls of nuts just begging to be cracked. I swear, whatever HARD candy that didn't get eaten one year got shoved back in the bag and was there to greet us the next year! I guess there was no 'shelf life' standard, unless something was obviously rotten!

As far back as I can remember, we always had a Christmas tree and at least one bigger gift under that tree. Most of the years that I was at home I remember we had a real cut down tree. A couple of those years, when we lived in Colorado, I even remember us going out as a family and cutting down our own tree and bringing it home. I thought it to be strange that the tree we cut down in the woods always looked much better in the woods than it did when we got it home and stood it up. And yes, there were a couple of years when those fake silver trees with the four colored turn wheel lights were the 'hottest thing'. So even 'from the other side of the tracks' my mom attempted to keep us in the proverbial 'loop'.

The first thing that went on the tree were the lights. Keep in mind when I say Christmas lights, I'm talking about those BIG burn the skin off your arm if you touched them lights. Being the oldest of the FIVE boys I guess I had earned the 'rite of passage', if you will, of stringing the rows of lights on the tree. And oh yah, I always placed the star on the top of the Christmas trees. The ole 'roll-a-dex' slows and there is a tear in my eye today as I can still see my mom and my brothers sitting there anxiously with the Christmas music playing on the hy-fy waiting for me to finish. When the lights were finally on mom would release my brothers to begin putting TONS of those old colored glass bulb decorations on the tree. Mom always encouraged us with what a great job we were doing. But honestly, I remember only the bottom two thirds of the tree being COVERED due to the fact that 3 out of the 4 brothers could only reach so high on the tree. I bet that any of you with children or grandchildren can relate to the abundance of Christmas decorations my mother had accumulated over the years from FIVE boys. Everything we had ever made in school my mother kept. And guess what? Even all those years of old decorations mom still had us hang them on the Christmas tree every year.

Through the years I was always 'the light hanger'. Through writing this little piece it has become obvious to me that I'm still that guy. I know that Jesus wasn't talking about us being 'showy' and He said so in these next Scriptures. But instead He wants us to allow Him to shine through us to the rest of the world around us. Listen, "You are the light of the world. A town built on a full cannot be lidden. Nather do you light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on a stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may say your good deads and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16) I want people to see the Jesus IN me and I guess I just bumped it up a couple more notches with the outside 'light' decorations.

Each year it surprises me how many more people in our neighborhood get out there and decorate with something. I'll close with this.

I guess shepherds were sort of like 'those guys from the other side of the tracks'. In Luke 2:8-14 we read, "And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you Good News that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.' Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests.'" In these Scriptures and the ones in Matthew 1:18-25 we see the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophesy in Isaiah 9:6. And you know what? Wise men/women from 'both sides of the tracks' still seek Him!! Merry Christmas!

I've been doing what I was sent here for and that is to tell people about our Lord Jesus Christ, I don't let the enemy shoot me down. Like it says in Romans 8:31, "What shall we say about such wonderful things as these? If God is for us, who can ever be against us?" and Romans 8:37, "No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us." ...

So, for eight or so years the only consistent thing I've had, next to my grandma, was every month and birthday, like clockwork, I got the newsletters, and heartfelt brotherly and sisterly love birthday card. Or I never sent a thank you back or let you know if I moved, for that I'm truly sorry from the bottom of my heart. I was so selfish. There was countless times I was going to and just never did, and tons of times the newsletter and birthday day blessing was spot on. God works in mysterious ways! I always did turn other people on to you guys though.

I've always read them and always believed in Jesus. I would be walking the good narrow path and time and time again I would go back to drugs and let the devil take me down such a dark place. It's like in **Matthew 13**, the story of the farmer, when Jesus was telling the crowd in Galilee. I didn't have my seeds planted in the right places. The evil one always came and stole my seed from my heart. Long story short, I hit rock bottom! Now I've built my foundation on rock. I just let Him take the wheel Amen!

Matthew 13:1-9 - "That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sew his seed. As he was seathering the seed, some full along the path, and the birds same and ste it up. Same full on really places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were searched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed full among thoms, which grew up and challed the plants. Still other seed full on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. Wheever has ears, let them hear."

Matthew 13:18-23 - "Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatabes away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or passeution comes because of the word, they quickly full away. The seed falling among the thoms refers to someone who hears the word, but the words of this life and the descriptioness of wealth choks the word, making it unfull-ful. But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."

I still make mistakes every day, but I learn from them and try to be a better person, friend, brother and Christian every day. I finally see the light. All along, I had Jesus through you guys this whole time. I'm so glad Jesus has put you guys in my life. I feel like I know "Duck" a little bit now from reading his testimonies.

The Prince of Preachers
By Charles Spurgeon in 1889

"I called Him - but He gave me no answer." (Song of Solomon 5:6)

Prayer sometimes tarries, like a petitioner at the gate, until the king comes forth to fill her bosom with the blessings which she seeks. The Lord, when He has given great faith, has been known to try it by long delays. He has allowed His servants voices to echo in their ears - as from a brazen sky. They have knocked at the golden gate - but it has remained unmovable, as though it were rusted upon its hinges. Like Jeremiah, they have cried, "You have covered Yourself with a cloud - that our prayer should not pass through."

Thus have true saints continued long in patient waiting without reply, not because their prayers were not vehement, nor because they were unaccepted - but because it so pleased Him who is sovereign, and who gives according to His own pleasure. If it pleases Him to bid our patience exercise itself - shall He not do as He wills with His own? Beggars must not be choosers - either as to time, place or form.

But we must be careful not to take delays in prayer for denials! God's long - dated bills will be punctually honored. Nor must we allow satan to shake our confidence in the God of truth - by pointing to our unanswered prayers. Unanswered prayers are not unheard. God keeps a file for our prayers - they are not blown away by the wind - they are treasured in the King's archives. This is the registry in the court of heaven - wherein every prayer is recorded. Tried believer, your Lord has a tear bottle in which the costly drops of scared grief are stored away - and a book in which your holy groanings are numbered. By-and-by, your prayers shall be answered. Can you not be content to wait a little? Will not your Lord's time - be better than your time? By-and-by He will comfortably appear, to your souls joy, and make you put away the sackcloth and ashes of long awaiting - and put on the scarlet and fine linen of full fruition.

Foot's Bible Study Rotes

2 Chronicles 35:1-36:23

Josiah ignored Necho's message because of who Necho was, king of a pagan nation. The mistaken assumption that Necho could not be part of God's larger plan cost Josiah his life. While not everyone who claims to have a message from God really does, God's message may come in unexpected ways. God has spoken to pagan kings in the past. (Genesis 12:17-20; Genesis 20:3-7; Daniel 4:1-3) Don't let prejudice or false assumptions blind you to God's message. (35:21-24)

God warned Judah about its sin and continually restored the people to His favor, only to have them turn away. Eventually, the situation was beyond remedy. Beware of harboring sin in your heart. The day will come when remedy is no longer possible and God's judgment replaces His mercy. Sin often repeated, but never repented of, invites disaster. (36:16)

1 Corinthians 1:1-2:5

Grace is God's free gift of salvation given to us in Christ. Receiving it brings us peace. (Romans 5:1) In a world of noise, confusion, and relentless pressures, people long for peace. Many give up the search, thinking it impossible to find, but true peace of heart and mind is available to us through faith in Jesus Christ. (1:3)

God's way of thinking is not like the world's way (normal human wisdom). And God offers eternal life, which the world can never give. We can spend a lifetime accumulating wisdom and yet never learn how to have a personal relationship with God. We must come to the crucified and risen Christ to receive eternal life and the joy of a personal relationship with our Savior. (1:19)

Psalm 27:1-14

David's greatest desire was to live in God's presence each day of his life. Sadly, this is not the greatest desire of many who claim to be believers. But those who desire to live in God's presence each day will be able to enjoy that relationship forever. (27:4)

Waiting for God is not easy. Often it seems that He isn't answering our prayers or doesn't understand the urgency of our situation. That kind of thinking implies that God is not in control or is not fair. But God is worth waiting for. *Lamentations* 3:24-26 calls us to hope in and wait for the Lord because often God uses times of waiting to refresh, renew, and teach us. Make good use of your waiting times by discovering what God may be trying to teach you in them. (27:14)

Proverbs 20:20-23

Sometimes what seems to be sudden luck turns out to be a dismal turn of fortune. What seems too good to be true, often is. (20:21)

"Dishonest scales" refers to the loaded scales a merchant might use in order to cheat customers. Dishonesty is a difficult sin to avoid. It is easy to cheat if we think no one is looking. But dishonesty affects the very core of a person. It makes him untrustworthy and untrusting. It eventually makes him unable to know himself or relate to others. Don't take dishonesty lightly. Even the smallest portion of dishonesty contains enough of the poison of deceit in your life, tell God about it now.

"You know when I'm sleeping, when I'm awake and if I'm bad or good, and I have to tell you what I want?!"



Thank you for the card, and I found your words not only inspiring and uplifting but bearing witness to that of my own spirit. I pray that you and all the brothers and sisters there at Signal have a blessed Christmas. Christmas use to be a very depressing time of the year for me, for I grew up very poor and I can only remember a few Christmases in which we had gifts or anything like that. When we did get gifts, it was usually a shirt, pair of shoes or something that we really needed.

Since I have been a Christian, I find Christmas to be the most joyful time of the year for me as I am so thankful for God's gift to us "Jesus" and what He did for us at the Cross. How can I not be joyful and thankful? Of course, it's somewhat sad being separated from your family during the holidays but I only have one sister that's still living. Just in the last 2 1/2 years' I've lost my father, my sister, Sherry, and last week my mother went to be with the Lord. She was almost 90 years old and we were very close. But I see her passing as being merciful and I've spent the past week just thanking the Lord for taking her home. I know someday we'll be reunited and I know she is with Jesus now, in His kingdom and that is a very comforting thought.

My mother had a very hard life. The first 45 years of her life were rough, she went through the aftermath and reconstruction of Germany after World War I and she lost one of her eyes during World War II. My mother's father by the way was Jewish, but that was kept a secret for many years for obvious reasons. You could just look at her and tell she was Jewish. I look just like her and my grandfather by the way. Anyway, my birth father married her, brought her over to this country and abandoned her to fend for herself and four children. It took me a long time to forgive him for that and his abusive treatment of her. But years later she met and married a good Christian man, Bob, who I always thought of as my father. So the latter years of my mother's life were better than the beginning and I can only thank the Lord for that! The last 45 years of my mother's life were good, and those are the years I want to remember.

I will, by the way be buried next to her when I pass. As for my health well on the most part, I think I'm doing pretty good. I have a few things going on, but nothing I'm too concerned about. I have a pause in my heartbeat every minute (I forget what they call it) and I have a diseased aorta, which will eventually cause me some problems, but I am not dwelling on none of that. I know and I've told a number of people this, "Jesus has His hand on the Pause, Stop and Restart buttons, so I'm in good hands" in that respect! One thing I know, if I don't know anything else, I know this until the Lord is finished with me I ain't going nowhere!

I understand where you are coming from in relation to not asking people about their past and I wish I could forget mine, but there's always something there to remind you of all those things that you'd like so much to forget, but can't. The reason I was given the death sentence was because the person we killed was a witness to another murder, they were hit in the head with a tire iron and thrown into a gravel pit. The person who was with me at this time was someone close to me, for they offered me a manslaughter charge (twice) if I'd turn states evidence, but of course I refused and as a result I ended up going to death row. When I came off death row, I paid two guards to bring me a pistol. I was at Lucasville then, I had been scheduled to appear in court in Columbus on my appeal, but things didn't work out and as a result, I ended up taking five guards hostage. I shot and killed one of the guards. That's why they transferred me out here. The guards back in Ohio tried to kill me several times and they almost did, but I understand it. Even when I was on death row, I had no problem with them executing me that's just how I was raised, you make your own bed and you lay in and you die in it.

I was involved with some pretty dangerous people when I was out there. I think I mentioned it in my testimonial that my brother was hooked up with the Columbia Cartel for decades and later my step brother became the president of the Dayton Outlaws. All my partners are dead now, most violently. I have a lot of blood on my hands and I'll be honest with you after I got saved it took me years before I was able to forgive myself for the things I've done. I just could not understand how a Just and Holy God could show someone like me mercy and forgive me. My mind could not comprehend that kind of love that kind of mercy. I'm crying now as I think about it. Me of all people deserved no mercy! People ask me sometimes what has kept me focused on the Lord these past 18 years and I tell them, "You don't know what the Lord brought me out of. I look at the Cross and I am reminded that Jesus died a horrible death for someone like me and I am reminded that it was me, Wayne who nailed Jesus to that Cross that it was my sins that killed Him." I tell people, "I have the blood of God's Son on my hands, how can I not love Him and live for Him?" That's how I feel about it and that's how I see it.

I ask the Lord all the time, "What kind of God are you that you would suffer and die such a horrible death for someone like me?" I always get the same answer, "One who loves you." It breaks my heart when I think about it, and that's a good thing. Like you, I don't judge others who am I to cast any stones, after all the horrible things I've done. I know how it feels to be falsely accused, due to my past. I try not to think about the past, but there is always something there to trigger a memory. You take care of yourself and know that you and all the brothers and sisters there at the in my thoughts and prayers. Merry Christmas - W.R.

I have so much to share and talk about, but I just wanted to make this a brief intro so you know a little about myself.
