

Tone 8 Hypakoe (Pascha)

Before the <u>dawn Mary</u> and the <u>women came</u> and found the <u>stone</u> <u>rolled</u> away from the tomb. They heard the angelic <u>voice</u>: "Why do you seek among the <u>dead</u> as a Man the One Who is <u>everlasting Light?</u>
Behold the <u>clothes</u> in the <u>grave</u>; go and pro<u>claim</u> to the world: 'The Lord is <u>risen</u>; <u>He</u> has <u>slain</u> death, as He is the <u>Son</u> of <u>God</u>, saving the <u>race</u> of man.'"

Tone 8 Kontakion (Pascha)

You descended <u>into</u> the <u>tomb</u>, O Im<u>mor</u>tal, You de<u>stroyed</u> the <u>pow</u>er of death. In victory <u>You</u> a<u>rose</u>, O <u>Christ</u> God, proclaiming: "Rejoice!" <u>to</u> the Myrrhbearing <u>Wo</u>men,// granting peace to Your Apostles, and bestowing Resurrection on the fallen."

The Reading is from the Acts of the Holy Apostles Acts 1:1-8

The former account I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach, until the day in which He was taken up, after He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments to the apostles whom He had chosen, to whom He also presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by them during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God. And being assembled together with *them*, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father,

"which," *He said*, you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" And He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. The reading is from the Gospel according to St. John

1:1-17

In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.

This man came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all through him might believe. He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light. That was the true Light which gives light to every man coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came to His [c]own, and His own did not receive Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. John bore witness of Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me is preferred before me, for He was before me.' " And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace. For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

Instead of "it is right in truth"

The angel cried to the Lade Full of Grace. Rejoice, Pure Virgin, Again I say: Rejoice. Your Son is Risen from His three days in the tomb. With Himself He has raised up all the dead: Rejoice, all peoples.



PASCHA (Easter) LETTER

Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!

Have you thought about what was it that led the Myrrh-bearing Women to visit the tomb with fragrant oils, when they still did not have enough faith in the Resurrection? What was it that gathered the Apostles and kept them together in a single house



after the Crucifixion of Christ, still before His Resurrection? It was nothing else, but their LOVE for the Lord Jesus Christ that led them to His tomb. It was nothing else, but their LOVE for the Crucified Lord Jesus Christ that kept them faithful.

My dear Brothers and Sisters, dear Parishioners and Friends, as we are approaching the Greatest Feast of Feasts - the Glorious Resurrection - Pascha of the Lord (Easter), I want you to reflect upon the virtue of LOVE which the Lord Himself teaches us. Let us remember that in order to have the faith of the Apostles and Myrrh-bearing Women, we need to LOVE our Lord Jesus Christ just like they did! To be able to witness the Glorious Resurrection, we need to have enough LOVE to be with the Lord at the time of Crucifixion also. To experience our own transformation - we have to embrace and LOVE the Gospel that will lead us to that. To have the Lord guide us through life - we have to develop LOVE for His commandments and teachings. To earn our own Resurrection - we have to accept and develop LOVE for our own cross. And finally, to have our Savior save us - we have to LOVE Him and LOVE one another - as that is the only way to salvation!

My Beloved, let us accept and embrace the commandment of LOVE. Not only because it's a commandment but "...because He first LOVEd us" (1 John 4:19). Let us seek the Resurrected Lord through living faith and active LOVE. Following the example of the gatherings of the Apostles, let us seek Him with LOVE in the gatherings of our Church! Like the travelers to the tomb, let us seek Him with love through our conversations about Him at home, at work or at school, with our family and our friends or at least have them in our own hearts. And like the Myrrh-bearing Women, let us seek Him with LOVE in deeds of compassion and charity for those in need. And then, He will indeed come to LOVE us as well. He will illumine the eyes of our heart and in holy contemplation, in pure joy, and in the blessedness of a peaceful conscience, He will truly appear to each of us Himself! And in the fear of God and with faith and LOVE, we will be the witnesses of the most profound and joyous of all truths: "Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!"

Sts. Peter & Paul Parish HISTORY FACTS

From 1939 to 1941 the construction of the church cost about \$19,000, not



including the work of the parishioners. From 1941-1946 the construction of the church cost \$18,064.32. Therefore, the total cost was about \$38,000. In 1946, the debt of the construction amounted to somewhat less than \$4,000 and was paid for with sufficient funds at that time.

"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die.." (John 11:25-26)

The Resurrection of the Lord

The Feast of the Resurrection in the Orthodox Church is commonly known as Pascha (Greek term for the word Passover). It is the Lord's Pascha, since Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed (1 Cor. 5:7). The Son of God passed over from death to life, and from earth to heaven. This is the fulfillment of the Great Work of God and the economy of salvation – the redemption of mankind from enslavement to Satan and corruption.

Christ's Pascha is the point of reference for all Orthodox Christians – it is the foundation of our faith and life. If there had been no Resurrection, the great apostle explains, then our Christian faith would have been deprived of any foundation or value, 'If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain...If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins.' – 1 Cor. 15:14.17

Without the message of the resurrection, there would be no Good News for the world to receive! The disciples of the Lord would have lived out their lives troubled and in despair, hiding behind closed doors for fear of the Jews. It was only after they encountered the risen Lord that their fear was overcome. The resurrection became their message and their hope. The resurrection became their Gospel. And the message was loud and clear,

Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death! The power of sin is destroyed and Death itself is abolished.

The resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth not only confirmed that He indeed is the expected Messiah of Israel, but unveiled Him as the King and Lord of the New Jerusalem...

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth...the holy city, New Jerusalem. And I heard a great voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with men. He will dwell with them, and they shall be his people...He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain any more, for the former things have passed away (Rev. 21:1-4).

The Resurrection of Christ grants us, the children of God, a share and an inheritance in the Heavenly Kingdom – thereby reclaiming the Paradise once lost. Through the resurrection we share in Christ's victory over death and are restored to communion with the living God.

May we never lose sight of the power of the Resurrection of Christ our Redeemer.


