"Cleaning Out"

To take my mind off the violence of the world, so I don't go mad from it or become part of it, I have taken to "cleaning out." Car, closets, cabinets, and cupboards are all subject to this coping strategy. While my reason for doing this is tragic, or perhaps even selfish, the act itself is one of love.

Two years ago, I wrote a newsletter article about de-cluttering, but today I'm writing about more than that. The Swedish call it "Death Cleaning," the object of which is to save our loved ones from having to go through a mountain of stuff after we die. Morbid? Maybe. But if you approach it through the lens of love, it becomes a heroic act for which your family will bless you. And the good news is, you don't need to be near death to do it!

In Sunday's sermon, I talked briefly about our penchant for accumulation. This Sunday's Scripture is about the cost of discipleship, where Jesus specifically states, "None of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions."

Ouch. So, it's not just the rich young ruler who needs to lighten his load, it's you and I, and anyone who wants to be a disciple of Christ. As I clean out closets, I consider the things I'm hanging onto and why. Am I willing to part with this? Why am I hanging on to that? Do I need any of my precious possessions to do the work God has placed before me?

Even at church, I must ask those questions. For instance, when I first came to Rinn, the phone in my office didn't work. Sharon and Rusty tried to get it working, then decided to get the phone company to come take a look. But by then I had determined I can do without a phone in my office. When someone calls the church looking for me, Julie takes a number and I call the person back. So, no, I don't need a phone in my office to do the work God has placed before me.

Swedish Death Cleaning isn't really about death, or about cleaning; the focus is on taking the time to discern what we truly need in life, or as we might say, to lead a Christian life. I am taking that discernment to heart and hopefully, while I purge the spaces I inhabit of unneeded and unwanted items, the world will also learn to purge itself of its violent ways.
