Letter From the President

Happy 2018!

We have some exciting news to share! First, some background....last fall we discovered that our Bank of America accounts were in danger of being closed. Some new banking regulations required additional information. We did some research, took a trip to the branch and provided that information to the bank. Unfortunately it was not acceptable to BofA. Valerie McGrew and I had a meeting with Fr. De Heredia where we found out the tax information used on the account was no longer valid. It had been changed many years ago by the Archdiocese, unbeknownst to our organization. Our options were to make a request to the parish and Archdiocese to use their new ID and maintain 501.c tax status or get our own tax ID. If we wanted our own ID, we couldn't continue to use the name St. Johns. If we stayed with the parish, it would have been necessary to turn over the funds in our CD account to the Archdiocese and then "borrow" it back. The Archdiocese would have the authority to decline requests to borrow the money back.

I believed it was in the best interest of the association to obtain our own tax ID and open a new account – the members of the board agreed and as of December 2017, we have an ID, a new name and a new bank account. Currently, we have \$20,130.00 combined in our checking and savings accounts.

We have made a \$1000 donation to the Ursuline Sisters in Santa Rosa in the hope that it alleviates some of the costs associated with last year's fires.

Moving forward, if you write a check for dues or luncheon payment, please please use the name Ursuline Alumnae Association – better yet, pay online!

Also, huge thanks go out to Valerie McGrew and Christine Keane for helping navigate this whole process – it's literally taken us months to sort everything out.
