

Field & Crop Update From Chad (Sep 2014)

With the cool August we had, there have been concerns of having a later and wetter corn crop. Normally we have hotter, drier weather in late August and early September that dries the whole entire plant. Once the plant is totally brown we rely on warm and windy days to remove moisture.

The rainfall we have had over the last two weeks has kept our corn plants greener than normal. The husks are turning brown, starting to open, and losing moisture through the healthy green stalk. I believe we can feel optimistic our corn crop will not be as late and wet as we thought it would be.
