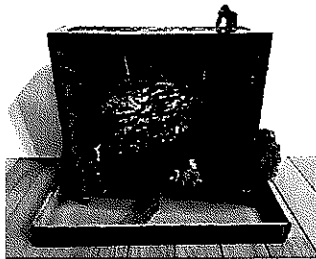
Welcome to Summer! To encourage students to enjoy quality literature and continue developing their independent reading skills, we ask that each student engage in our Summer Reading Program. Each student will be assigned a developmentally appropriate book according to their Lexile level to read over the summer break. This summer reading is an essential component of your child's education.

Upon completion of the reading, your child will have three activities to complete. The first will be a Vocabulary Graphic Organizer. Your child will be responsible for identifying four words that are difficult to pronounce, unknown, or sparks an interest and then fill out the graphic organizer.

Second, your child will complete the Story Elements Graphic Organizer. This graphic organizer was chosen for your child because these elements were covered in the previous grade and will be enforced next year.

The third will be a diorama. A diorama is a three-dimensional scene which includes models of people, buildings, plants, and/or animals of one of the main events of the book in a shoebox. Also, included should be a written description of the scene.

The vocabulary graphic organizer, story elements graphic organizer and diorama with a written description of the scene will be due Friday, August 24th, 2018.

In addition to these activities, at this stage of development you should try to read to your child or have him read to you for at least 20 minutes a day. Kindergarten to First Grade students are expected to read 10-15 minutes each day independently. Students in Grade 2 should read independently every day for 15-20 minutes.
