
OUR PARK

Pet Owner's Alert:

Poisonous Toad: There has been an outbreak of Bufo toads in our neighborhood. The Giant Toad (a.k.a. Marine Toad or Cane Toad) is the largest of the toads found in Florida. When it is threatened or handled, it secretes a highly toxic milky substance from its large *parotoid glands* at the back of its head, behind the ears. This secretion can burn your eyes, may irritate your skin, and **can kill cats and dogs if they ingest the secretion.** Adult toads generally range in size from 6 to 9in but may get larger. These guys are really ugly!

Symptoms of poisoning in pets include drooling, head-shaking, crying, loss of coordination, and, in more serious cases, convulsions. The dog's (or cat's) gums often turn red. Treatment: If you suspect toad poisoning, get a hose and run water in the side of the dog's/cat's mouth, pointing the animal's head downward so water isn't swallowed. Rub the gums and mouth to remove the toxin and call your veterinarian immediately. For your dogs safety keep it leashed when walking.

Possible Coyote Activity: Unfortunately one of our neighbor's cat has been killed and it may have been by a coyote.
