Our Voices Were Heard!

Our city leaders heard us loud and clear on May 14, 2019 when the San Diego City Council approved Mayor Faulconer's new proposed ban on people sleeping in their vehicles. The new ban prevents folks from staying in their vehicles where overnight parking isn't allowed. This includes areas outside of businesses, near the beach and on residential streets. In an effort to help those that sleep in their cars the mayor's proposal includes the expansion of designated parking lots.

BTNA Clean Beach Adoption

BTNA adopted Windansea and Marine Street beaches via the "I Love a Clean San Diego" Adopt-a-Beach program. In doing this, we are committing to 3 beach cleanups per year which will continue to foster community involvement and beautify our neighborhood. Barber Tract Beach Cleanup : A Complete Success!

We held our beach cleanup in April and had 59 volunteers. This tireless group collected 113 lbs of trash and recyclables. Student volunteers accounted for 25% of participants. Great way to earn volunteer hours. Next clean up scheduled for July 13, 2019.

Barber Tract Street Improvements

We are committed to continuing the repair and replacement of old streets within our neighborhood. Next on the list of priorities is Olivetas Ave., Dunemere, Neptune Pl. and Fern Glen. We will be engaging our local government and will be keeping you posted on our progress.

Barber Tract Sidewalk Improvements

Some of our neighbors have gotten seriously injured from tripping over bad spots on our sidewalks. This is a serious problem for our neighborhood. Homeowners are responsible for the maintenance and repair of sidewalks on their property unless damage is caused by a city planted tree. The city is still offering to share the costs of replacement 50-50 (see https://www.sandiego.gov/street-div/services/roadways/sidewalk). Poorly maintained sidewalks are one of the major complaints in our neighborhood. If you have a sidewalk in need of repair or replacement, please get it addressed and help us avoid more injuries. We will be taking steps to contact property owners directly to alert them to this problem where it exists. Update on Under-grounding Utilities

Many of us will agree that the utility poles and overhead lines in the Barber Tract are quite an eyesore. San Diego has had a program under way for many years (that we pay for) to relocate these lines underground. Several years ago, the utility poles and lines in Barber Tract from Dunemere north were all under grounded. No further under grounding work has been done south of Dunemere in the Barber Tract since the initial work.

The resident engineer for the San Diego Utilities Under-grounding Program has advised that the remaining utility under ground work is still in preliminary planning for our neighborhood. And it might still be several years before work begins as the schedule currently stands.

The only reason the BT streets were converted previously is because of a strong concerted effort from the neighbors in that area. It was a lot of hard, ongoing work requiring continual inquiry and follow up with the city. The best way to get priority on this work, is to have neighbors that are affected get actively involved to work with the city.

If you're interested in a leadership role to get the utility lines moved under ground on your street, sooner rather than later, please contact me. We've learned that when our neighborhood teams up together to get things accomplished, such as our recent major street repairs, we can get more priority with the city on our concerns.
