Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28

<sup>11</sup> At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert toward the daughter of my people, not to winnow or

cleanse, <sup>12</sup> a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgment against them.

<sup>22</sup> "For my people are foolish;

they do not know me;

they are stupid children;

they have no understanding.

They are skilled in doing evil

but do not know how to do good."

- <sup>23</sup> I looked on the earth, and it was complete chaos, and to the heavens, and they had no light.
- <sup>24</sup> I looked on the mountains, and they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro.
- <sup>25</sup> I looked, and there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled.
- <sup>26</sup> I looked, and the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the LORD, before his fierce anger.
- <sup>27</sup> For thus says the LORD: The whole land shall be a desolation, yet I will not make a full end.
- <sup>28</sup> Because of this the earth shall mourn and the heavens above grow black,

for I have spoken; I have purposed;

I have not relented, nor will I turn back.

#### Psalm 14

<sup>1</sup> Fools say in their hearts, "There is no God." They are corrupt; they do abominable deeds; there is no one who does good.

<sup>2</sup> The LORD looks down from heaven on humankind to see if there are any who are wise, who seek after God.

<sup>3</sup> They have all gone astray; they are all alike perverse; there is no one who does good, no, not one.

- <sup>4</sup> Have they no knowledge, all the evildoers who eat up my people as they eat bread and do not call upon the LORD?
- <sup>5</sup> There they shall be in great terror, for God is with the company of the righteous.
- <sup>6</sup> You would confound the plans of the poor, but the LORD is their refuge.
- <sup>7</sup>O that deliverance for Israel would come from Zion! When the LORD restores the fortunes of his people, Jacob will rejoice; Israel will be glad.

#### **NEW TESTAMENT LESSON**

2 Corinthians 4:1-12

¹ Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. ² We have renounced the shameful, underhanded ways; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God. ³ And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing clearly the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus's sake. ⁶ For it is the God who said, "Light will shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

<sup>7</sup> But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. <sup>8</sup> We are afflicted in every way but not crushed, perplexed but not driven to despair, <sup>9</sup> persecuted but not forsaken, struck down but not destroyed, <sup>10</sup> always carrying around in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. <sup>11</sup> For we who are living are always being handed over to death for Jesus's sake, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our mortal flesh. <sup>12</sup> So death is at work in us but life in you.





Singer and composer Harry T. Burleigh studied at the National Conservatory of Music from 1892 to 1896. He is recognized as the first African-American composer to employ spirituals in concert arrangements.
