QUICK FACTS:

Israeli Apartheid & AFC

Authoritative reports by human rights experts, legal analysts, and renowned scholars have clearly established that Israel's systemic oppression of Palestinians is an apartheid regime. As we did for South Africa, faith communities and people of conscience around the world are coming together to end this crime against humanity.

What is apartheid?

First, it is important to know that **South Africa's experience** is <u>not</u> the benchmark today for identifying apartheid. We have instruments of international law that define it for us. Apartheid is defined as a crime against humanity; it involves inhuman acts committed for the purpose of establishing and maintaining domination by one racial group over another and systematically oppressing them.



To recognize apartheid, three conditions must be met:

- 1. establishing a system of separation or segregation for domination based on race, creed, or ethnicity;
- 2. that system must be legally enforced;
- 3. that system entails the commission of inhuman acts as specified in international law. This definition is codified in the 1973 International Convention on the Suppression and Punishment of the Crime of Apartheid and the 1998 Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court.









Who says it's apartheid in Israel/Palestine?

In recent years, a global consensus on Israeli apartheid has emerged. Leading human rights organizations such as **Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch** have published in-depth reports that identify and explain Israel's apartheid regime, with ample documentation. Many other experts on human rights and international law have similar reports, from the **United Nations** to **Israel's own** human rights organizations, **B'Tselem and Yesh Din**...

All these institutions are finally acknowledging the apartheid reality that the Palestinians have been reporting - and which visiting South African leaders have unanimously confirmed - for decades.
