July Yard of the Month

The FAC HOA Yard of the Month selection for July 2019 is 2508 Eagleview Circle, belonging to Ken Campbell and Ellie Nolan. Several clumps of aspen trees planted when the original landscaping was installed have been removed. With increased sunlight and less competition for water, the other plants, shrubs and lawn have become healthier. Ken says the lawn requires significantly less water after removal of the aspens. There are a few roots remaining to deal with; however, in the second-year post removal, the roots are composting into the soil. A new shade tree has been planted in the front yard to replace a tree that succumbed to the early cold-snap several years ago. Ken's and Ellie's front porch area is framed by formal hedges of holly, boxwoods and juniper pfitzers that are always neatly pruned. The west side yard features a variety of perennials such as lilies that are currently in bloom. Ken and Ellie comment there are usually numerous peony bushes and other perennials that bloom; however, this year the bunnies that have taken up residence in the FAC neighborhood "chewed" everything to the ground except for the lilies. The front yard provides a pleasant, relaxing view while relaxing on the front porch. Congratulations to Ken and Ellie, Yard of the Month – July 2009.



Tree Trimming over Sidewalks

Longmont code requires trees be trimmed to 8 ft over sidewalks and 15 ft over streets. Please take a look at any trees you may have over sidewalks to the side or front of your house and be sure that you are meeting Longmont's code.

Spring/Summer Yard Maintenance

Please keep an eye on your yards especially side yards for any volunteer aspen trees and weeds that are growing. The planting of new aspens are not allowed by property guidelines and yards should be maintained to eliminate weeds. Volunteer aspens growing in your yard must be cut down and/or pulled and not left to mature. Thank you!
