
DID YOU KNOW 2

July 20, 1969

Apollo 11 was the spaceflight that first landed humans on the Moon. Commander Neil Armstrong and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin formed the American crew that landed the Apollo Lunar Module Eagle on July 20, 1969, at 20:17 UTC. Armstrong became the first person to step onto the lunar surface six hours 39 minutes later on July 21 at 02:56 UTC; Aldrin joined him 19 minutes later. They spent about two and a quarter hours together outside the spacecraft, and collected 47.5 pounds (21.5 kg) of lunar material to bring back to Earth. Command module pilot Michael Collins flew the command module Columbia alone in lunar orbit while they were on the Moon's surface.



Please note that due to mathematical effects of calculating the percentages on a smaller scale at the club level, each club's goal has been rounded. Goals for total membership and new members added have been rounded up so that the club may exceed the goal number, and goals for terminated members have been rounded down so that the club may come in under the goal number. Due to this rounding, the sum total of each club's goals shown here will accumulate to totals that are even better than our region's overall goals so if all of our clubs meet their goals, our region will certainly exceed these percentages on the region scale!



This benefits local moms in need and I was able to learn a little more about the program when I dropped off donations. Pretty cool in that they offer pre-natal care for moms-to-be,



including mobile ultrasound services and classes. Participants earn "bucks" for each of their visits (encouraging care) and can spend these "bucks" at the Hope Center. LaKeesha James-Smith was a past participant of the program and is now a Director for her own non-profit as well as a fellow Soroptimist, paying it forward and giving back.

SI 21st Convention-Kuala Lumpur Memories and Messages-

It's now 2 days after convention and I am sitting on my veranda looking at the South China Sea right after sunrise.....that part will be a future story.

I am now reflecting on the many thoughts and ideas that came from convention- too many to ever share!

What is important is the reality that this work we do as Soroptimists matters! We are noisy, enthusiastic, passionate, strong willed and clearly care about our communities and planet-particularly the women and girls who still-do not have equal standing - dare I say- anywhere!

- this convention brought many issues related to our planet-climate change and the importance of sustainability. We have personal choices we can make in addition to insisting our local, country and world governments face the climate change reality. It was chilling to learn that every day 10,000 people die for lack of potable water. This problem also has caused global migration and then the immigration crisis felt around the world. We learned some of the solutions- that aren't

-Women leaders in technology- we met 4 fascinating women from 4 fields and learned of their significant work in space, engineering and the medical field. The solution- STEM education for girls (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) and of course more PR and awareness of these women who have made significant inventions like the windshield wiper for instance!

10 workshops engaged members in important issues and opportunities to interact in a personal way with the topic. I had the privilege of working on two of them- Soroptimists and the UN and Soroptimists in the Digital World! I learned a lot from the participants representing many parts of the world.

-SI and Federation leadership is in good hands and excited to welcome our newest African sisters! - each of the federation leaders gave us a snapshot of the significant work we are doing! Advocacy Director Bev told us that we have 20 Soroptimists active in 7 agencies and are proud that we have brought our issues and concerns to many world platforms by consistently working on committees, making relationships, being known for professionalism, doing real "on the ground" work and our reliability!

We learned of the successes of our Past President Yvonne's Nepal Educate to Lead project has impacted 8,000 women and girls, and our amazing President Mariet's success with Women, Water and Leadership and really being part of the world's water agenda.

And...we can now look forward to a brand new project for the next two years- incoming President Sharon's Road to Equality! We all will certainly want to "get on the bus" and work toward addressing some of the most heinous human rights practices-FGM, Child Marriage, Human Trafficking, Domestic Violence, Elder Abuse and Migration.

Thanks for hanging in with me. The takeaways that support the work we have in front of us is the joy of the company we share as members. We instantly have a connection and a place of mutual importance! I am sure I got and gave hundreds of hugs, thousands of smiles and was photographed all too many times. 

Soroptimist International is a global volunteer organization working to improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment.


Current projects that our Canton/Stark County Club is involved with include:


