Cooked Playdough Recipe

2 cups white flour 1 cup salt 2 Tbsp. cream of tartar 2 cups of water 1 Tbsp. vegetable oil food colouring

Combine and cook ingredients over medium heat. Turn out onto counter and knead until smooth. Store in an airtight container.

Fundraising Update



Now that the children are typically getting ready by themselves for pick-up, please remember to empty out any crafts, newsletters, etc. from the back packs. Thank you!




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Learning through Play
