The Fortieth Anniversary dinner is over. We had about 30 members and guests in attendance. The meal was very good. The 3 Charter Members who spoke about the beginnings 40 years ago were very enlightening. There were 13 original members in 1985. I asked the Speakers if 13 was a lucky number and contributed to the fact that we are still growing. We held a silent auction and raised \$200.00 for the general budget of the Museum. Thanks to all who participated.

The painting has been completed on the train we were given by New Spring Church. Thank you to all who had a part in making this a great addition to the Museum.

We are nearly complete with the sorting and pricing project that has taken over 2 years of work. If you or a friend are looking for train-related items, please give the Museum a look. We have everything from accessories to train sets available for purchase. Remember, members get a 10% discount when they purchase items.

The Board has voted to change the hours of the Museum to 10-4 on Saturdays. These changes will be phased in through the end of the year to be effective 1-1-2026. The Board is also recommending an increase in the cost of admission. The proposal is to charge adults \$10 and children 6-12 to \$5. Children 5 and under will still be free. There has also been discussion about offering a 10% discount to Military, Senior Citizens, First Responders and Teachers. No Board recommendation has been made. It will be discussed at the July Board meeting and will be presented to the Members at the August Business Meeting. These changes will be phased in through the end of the year to be effective 1-1-2026.

As I announced to the Board in May, I will be stepping back from my responsibilities effective December 31, 2025. Nancy and I need a break from duties at the Museum. This has created several opportunities for you to volunteer. Opportunities include, Gift Shop, Board Member, President, Train Show Sales, Upstairs Train Sales, Finance Committee and working Donations. I hope you will consider what part you can have in making the Museum a great destination place.

I think I have rambled long enough. THANKS for all you do for The Wichita Toy Train Museum.

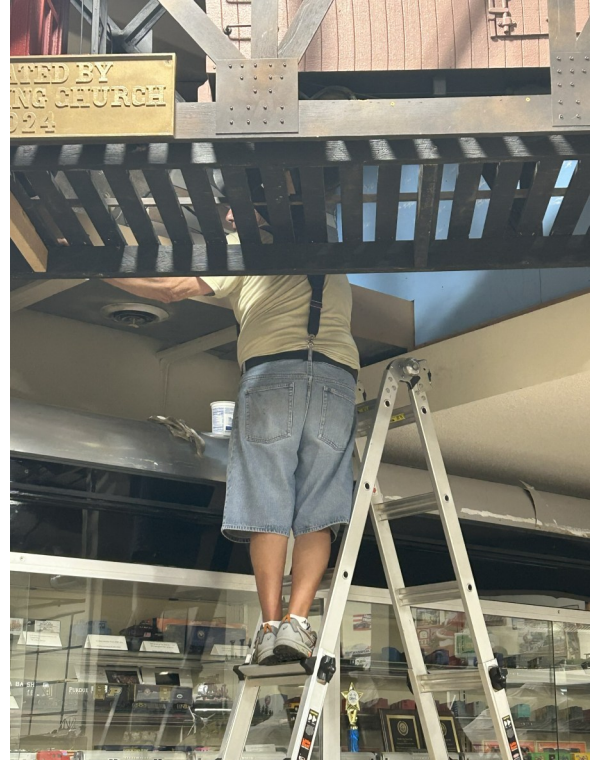
## Lockers
